- ⊙ The conference sessions officially begin on Wednesday afternoon at 1:00 pm with Holy Communion in the Hostetter Chapel.
- ⊙ The current pastor of each church is responsible to pick up his church's MINISTRY RESOURCE BAG (brown paper bag) upon registering.

## ON CAMPUS
