Location is Everything

We live just a few blocks up from what was once one of the busiest stretches of highway in the county. Except for a short rush hour surge, however, there's no longer a problem with traffic volume and road noise. The vehicle count is light and most of the businesses on the strip are closed and empty. A few others host a rapid succession of failed start ups. It has nothing to do with changed demographics or the economy. It's the "fault" of the by-pass.

What was once the "main drag" is now a long exit ramp. The majority of travelers race by on the new four lane highway a quarter mile away. The remnant of "Business Route 222" became a backwater without going anywhere. It was the people that moved not the place.

A similar effect may impact your ministry, and I'm not referring to your neighbors moving out of the neighborhood. People don't have to change where they live to change the way they think, believe, and behave. For a host of reasons many have moved away from the church emotionally and spiritually. Cultural and moral changes have left a good number of ministries feeling like they've been by-passed. If outsiders "drive by" on their way to making their life, it's as if they don't see Christianity standing by the road side.

The solution isn't as simple as a bigger, brighter sign out in front of your building, though that may not hurt. It may not even require the relocation of your facility. What it requires most is that we as the followers of Christ reposition ourselves back at the main intersections of where our unsaved friends travel. We need to bring the message of the cross back into the crossroads of daily life by loving our community enough to participate in it. Being there to care, take part, and just make it a better place to live, without strings attached, erects a living billboard pointing to Jesus by a busy roadside where most of the "traffic" goes.

How well are you located missionally? Do you occupy the "prime real estate" of involvement in the lives of non-believers? Or are you content being cut off in a religious cul de sac of your own making? Don't wait around hoping that they'll put the road back where it was. Go where the people Jesus died for are.

Assessments. Your Online Health Coach has detailed health information for you relevant to how you answered your Health Risk Assessment. Remember that through your login at www.myallonehealth.com you can access a nurse 24/7, check out medications on the Drug Guide, research medical conditions with the online medical encyclopedia, use one of the online "trackers" for meals/calories, exercise, your medications, and complete your own personal health record. This is just a short list of some of the health, wellness and medical features available to you.

Topic: "Ethics in the Marketplace"

We are pleased to welcome our former President and Professor of Christian Ethics to Evangelical Theological Seminary. Over the years Dennis has served in administrative, pastoral and seminary teaching ministries, including Vice Provost at Messiah College, Pastor of the Washington Community Fellowship on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C. and Associate Professor of Church & Society at Alliance Theological Seminary in Nyack, New York. He has served as an adjunct or visiting professor at several seminaries internationally, including Moscow Theological Seminary in Russia, Union Biblical Seminary in India and the Eastern European Seminary for Evangelical Leadership in Ukraine. He is also a visiting professor of Christian Ethics at Trinity International University in the graduate program in Bioethics.

Dennis is a frequent speaker in churches, pastors' conferences, seminaries, colleges and academic forums. He is the author of three books, including his most recent, *Head, Heart, Hands: Bringing Together Christian Thought, Passion and Action* (InterVarsity Press), and *Choosing the Good: Christian Ethics in a Complex World* (Baker Books). Baker will be publishing his next book, *The Meaning of Sex: A Framework for the Moral Life*. He has authored over sixty-five articles, mostly in ethics (including bioethics), church and society, and preaching. He is a board member for the C.S. Lewis Institute in Washington, D.C., is a Fellow with the Center for Bioethics and Human Dignity in Bannockburn, IL and for many years was a member of the Health Care Ethics Committee at Holy Spirit Hospital in Camp Hill, PA.

Dennis received the B.A. from Elizabethtown College, the M.Div. from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, the M.Phil. and Ph.D. from Drew University and did post-doctoral studies at Oxford University. He and his wife live in Beverly, MA and have two adult daughters.
