CALLING ALL PHILIPS

How many people do we know that have an interest in Jesus, want to explore the Christian faith, but they lack knowledge? What we need are more Philips. Remember him? According to the narrative in Acts 8, an angel directs Philip to go south to the desert road that runs from Jerusalem to Gaza. There, an official in charge of the treasury for Candace, queen of Ethiopia, is sitting in his chariot reading from Isaiah the prophet. Directed by the Spirit, Philip runs over to the Ethiopian and asks, “Do you understand what you’re reading?” His response to Philip is classic. “How can I, unless someone explains it to me?” At that, he invited Philip to come, sit with him and explain the Scripture. Beginning with the suffering servant passage in Isaiah 53, Philip expounded on the Scriptures and told him the good news about Jesus.



What about us? What inquisitive, seeking people that are exploring the Scriptures could we get to share with simply by asking the question, “Do you understand what you're reading?” As I ask that, I’m aware that another Holy Week is upon us. We who know and love the Lord will again take time during this week to attend special services and reflect on those Scriptures that emphasize all that Jesus, the suffering servant, went through for our sakes on his way to the cross. We will also celebrate Easter, rejoicing in our Lord’s resurrection victory over sin and the grave. I remind us to share the “Good News” of the Gospel story with those interested in learning more about our Jesus. If our purpose really is “to know Christ and make Him known,” then sharing like Philip did must become priority number one.

YOU LEAD 2011 will be traveling to Zaporozhe, Ukraine in June to work with EC missionary Ken Sears.

“You Lead” is an EC camp for teen leaders, usually held in Ohio or Illinois. The course is a three year cycle the third year of which is a mission trip for those who have participated in the camp in the US for at least one of the years. Year one offers “Keys of the Kingdom [of God]” followed by year two “Reclaiming the Kingdom”. The group travels in year three to use what they have learned “in the field.”

This year the team consists of Joe Dennis, Leighan Wells, Mary Hollingsworth, Rachel Nitache and Gary Brown, all based in Ohio. The Illinois group includes Annette Carr, Hannah DeVries, Sydney Koch, Kyle McIntyre, Abigail Willey and Nancy Wadsworth.

While in Ukraine the group will be helping with two very different camps—Camp I will be a VBS type gathering. The participants will be ages 7-12. Our group is responsible for crafts and games. Several work projects await us to help out the community. For Camp II we will travel to Feodosila (near the Black Sea). There we will participate in various seminars with teens from Ukraine discussing issues many teens face.

Participation in the AllOne Wellness program during 2010 remained constant in some areas but decreased in others. Involvement in AllOne Health Disease Management Programs remained stable in 2010, with over 100 members enrolled, and contact with health coaches was above average as compared to other AllOne clients. We experienced a decline in completed Health Assessments (HA) with only fifty-one HA completed compared to 119 HA completed in 2009 and only 24 participants qualified to receive the gift card incentives. 2011 will be the third year of AllOne and your active participation is strongly encouraged. Thank-you, to those that continue with the AllOne programs and are taking an active interest in your health.

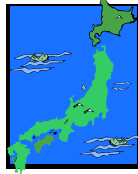

In a recent communication from Rev. Nobuo Abe, the Director of the EC Church in Japan, he expressed his deep appreciation for the prayers and concern on behalf of Japan from the EC Church in the United States and around the globe. To date over \$40,000 has been donated for Japan disaster relief! These funds will be sent to the EC Church of Japan so that they can administer them through their local, regional and national relief agencies in the name of Jesus Christ and the global EC Church. The leadership of the EC Church of Japan will keep us informed on the specifics of how these funds are used and we will do our best to pass that information on to all.

5. Short Term Mission Trip opportunities:

SHORT TERM MISSION OPPORTUNITIES! The Global Ministries Commission is working on two short term mission opportunities for youth this summer, plus one for a family or two couples.

- (1) Joe Toy will train a youth team in open air evangelism in inner city Philadelphia. Dates are July 31-August 6. Cost is approximately \$500 per person for housing, meals, and transportation to and from the Myerstown area to Philadelphia.
- (2) Brad and Maxine Waldman will work with a youth team in Trinidad. This will be a combination of light construction/maintenance work and helping a local church with children's VBS program. Dates are July 31-August 6. Cost is approximately \$1200 per person.
- (3) Ron and Brenda Anderson are looking for a family with teenagers or two couples to help at an English Language Camp in Spain this summer. Dates are July 11-18. The camp is held over the weekend of the 15-17, with two days of training ahead of time. The rest of the time you will have opportunities to do some sight-seeing and visit with other missionaries. Approximate costs in Spain are \$300 plus airfare.

Michael Jordan was still a superstar, but he began to trust in his teammates more and pass the ball to them. The team became a dynasty, winning six championships in the early 90's.

Bob Logan finishes this story with this line, "You might have a MDiv or a DMin. You might know more than many potential coaches. But if you want to be a champion, you need to get a coach and you need to develop a team and trust it."

I tend to think that aim should be a little more specific—you need to get the RIGHT coach! (Who was the coach of the Chicago Bulls before Phil Jackson?) The right coach has the right "chemistry" to bring out the best in you in every way.

I also believe that the trust factor is huge. In fact, I don't believe that anyone can operate on a team very well without trust in their teammates. What do you think?
