## Hey, I Know a Guy

**W**hen I was growing up, information spread two ways throughout the neighborhood; the ladies chatted while hanging their wash, and the men all gathered at the local barber shop and shared news. The women swapped recipes and talked about their children while the men talked about sports, cars, etc. Occasionally, someone would ask for a recommendation for a person to do home repairs – a roofer, electrician, etc. Usually at least one person would respond, “Hey, I know a guy who...” Fill in the blank for whatever service you needed. And often, because there was a personal recommendation by someone you knew who could vouch for the person recommended, you would trust them and make the contact.

That memory made me think of how we as believers share the Good News about Jesus with others. Most of us don't like to ‘witness’ to other people; it brings up connotations of being preachy, pushing your religion down other people's throats, etc. We try to spiritualize our lack of effort by saying, “I'm not an evangelist” or “that isn't my gift”. Yet the New Testament is full of instances when ordinary people gave witness to what Jesus had done for them. The Samaritan woman at the well in John 4 had a life changing encounter with Jesus. Afterwards, she went back to her village and said to the people, “Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Christ?” (John 4:29 NIV) In Luke, Zacchaeus is addressed by Jesus and told that the Master will be dining with him. Zacchaeus immediately acknowledges his sinful ways in front of everyone and vows to change them. (Luke 19:8)

Think about what the crowds who followed Jesus saw - “hey, I know a guy who can make the lame walk and the blind see!”. Or the disciples - “hey, I know a guy who can walk on water and calm the seas just by talking to them!” These are just a couple of examples of ordinary people whose encounters with Jesus brought about life changing results. And they weren't afraid to tell others about it.

There are many hurting, unhappy people in this world. You probably know some of them; people who are struggling with financial problems, dysfunctional families, or some form of addiction. Listen to them if they are willing to talk to you about their situations. And when the opportunity arises, share with them that you know someone who can help. They may not always want to hear what you have to say, but hopefully your life will bear witness that ‘hey, I know a guy who can change your life.’
