

There is a verse in scripture that has always captured my attention: Luke 9:51, “*As the time drew near for him to ascend to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem.*” (NLTse) As Jesus walked those miles toward Jerusalem, as he approached the end of his earthly life, he knew what he was

walking into, and he went anyway. His disciples and other followers tried to warn him, tried to stop him, but he was going to Jerusalem. It reminds me of a question Jesus asked of his parents years before his public ministry began. Jesus was only twelve years old when his parents thought he was lost, only to find him in the Temple. When they asked him what he was doing, he replied “*Didn’t you realize that I should be involved in my Father’s affairs?*” (Luke 2:49) One of the many words we can use to describe Jesus is focused. His entire life and ministry was focused on doing his Father’s will, redeeming humanity.

One of the key decisions made at our National Conference in 2010 was that the Evangelical Congregational Church would “establish disciple-making as the ultimate objective for all ministries.” That’s focus. In his book *Your Church Is Too Safe* Mark Buchanan makes a very important observation at some time in church history we stopped calling Christians “disciples” and started calling them “believers”. He writes, “A disciple is one who follows and imitates Jesus. She loses her life in order to find it. She steps in the language and culture of Christ until his Word and his world reshape hers, redefine her, change inside out how she sees and thinks and dreams and finally lives... A believer, not so. She holds certain beliefs, but how deep down these go depends on the weather or the mood. You can’t be a disciple without being a believer. But—here’s the rub—you can be a believer and not be a disciple. You can say all the right

things, think all the right things, believe all the right things, do all the right things, and still not follow and imitate Jesus.” He later notes “The kingdom of God is full of disciples, but our churches are filled with believers.”

We all know that Jesus told us to “go and make disciples of all the nations...” We have committed to make the focus of the Evangelical Congregational Church and our ministries to develop disciples so that our churches would be healthy and those disciples would disciple others. How are we doing with that? Is that the focus of our ministries and meetings? I don’t mean to suggest that the only thing we ever do is hold discipleship classes. In fact, I would suggest that true discipleship training takes place outside the church building where real life happens probably more than it does within the walls of a church building. Do we have that Christ-like focus so that whatever we’re doing is an opportunity to be doing what God says and what we say we want to be doing, which is making disciples of Jesus? My prayer is not that we simply start more disciple-making meetings; my prayer is that every local E.C. congregation develops into a disciple-making culture. It’s not just a way of organizing the church or even “doing” church differently; culture is who we are. We are called to be disciple-makers. That truth of scripture should shape our attitudes and motives, our perceptions and behaviors, the way we interact with everyone we meet. That’s a Christ-like focus on doing our Father’s will.

News from Benefits/Compensation



According to 2 Samuel the kings went off to war in the spring and in the summer EC Benefits begins the annual health insurance renewal process. You may make your own conclusions on the similarities of these two events.

Seriously, Trustees of the EC

Benefits Corp. are very aware of how the cost of health insurance affects the local church. With the change in insurers to Capital Blue Cross in October 2011 we entered the consumer driven health care market. Health insurers are pushing more responsibility for health care expenditures back on the insured or the consumer of the healthcare services. This was a drastic change for us and change can be hard. As the consumer of healthcare services it is in your best interest to discuss cost and fees with healthcare providers: doctors, hospitals, surgical centers, therapists, etc. Ask what will not be covered by the insurance, if there is a discount for cash, payment plans available, when is the payment due. I have heard instances of family physicians and chiropractors who have different rates for not billing an insurance company. Please educate yourself on your healthcare expenditures.

At renewal the shortcomings and concerns of our current healthcare plan and the HRA will be addressed. One of the main topics of discussion is benefit vs. cost. Less costly insurance is available but with lesser benefits. And the opposite is true, adding benefits adds costs. If you have concerns or suggestions on our current plan please contact Dave King or myself or any Trustee.

The HRA through PrimePay has been a rough spot for us this year. To ease some of that burden you can establish an online ac-

count with PrimePay. Instructions for establishing an online account can be found on the EC website (www.eccenter.com) under Benefits.

Retirement: As in years past Jennifer Buehler, Wells Fargo Advisors, had the most visitors during National Conference but please remember she is available for retirement planning assistance year round. Jennifer may be reached at 1-855-603-8146. We hope all our pastors are actively planning for their retirement; make consistent contributions to your 403(b) or Roth account (in addition to your church's contributions) and at a minimum spend an hour or two annually with a financial professional reviewing your investments. Please don't delay in becoming personally involved in your retirement planning.

Coach Training Alert

So, you're a minister or a leader in your church. Does empowering God's people through using a coach approach in your ministry work sound like something that would interest you? If your answer is yes, then consider the Two Day Basic Coach Training Event that the Leadership Commission will be offering at the E.C. Church Center on November 7 and 8. This training event is presented in cooperation with Coaching 4 Clergy and is designed to furnish leaders in ministry with basic coaching skills that will augment their natural skill sets and provide them with additional tools for leadership success. Based on Val Hasting's book *The Next Great Awakening*, those who participate will:

- Secure a working knowledge of coaching and coaching values
- Build core coaching skills impacting ministry
- Have the opportunity to connect theory and practice
- Observe LIVE coaching
- Learn a five step coaching model
- Receive a post-seminar complementary coaching session by a trained coach
- Be able to share in a 30 day follow-up group coaching call
- Have opportunity to receive CEU credit

Those who complete the seminar and participate in the complementary coach session and group coach call will receive a Certificate of Completion from Coaching 4 Clergy. The cost for this two day event is \$200.00 and includes the training, C4C resource materials, continental breakfasts, noon meals, break snacks and CEU credits.

This training event will be limited to a maximum of sixteen participants, so you will want to register early. News from the Evangelism & Discipleship Commission



The Evangelism and Discipleship Commission has become aware of a nation-wide evangelistic opportunity your church may want to incorporate into your fall ministries: *My Hope with Billy Graham*. This past April, over 100 evangelical leaders from the United State and Canada gathered at the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association offices in Charlotte, North Carolina, to discuss an evangelistic project that could reach North America. The meeting and the evangelistic project, come at the request of Billy Graham, who in spite of his 93 years, is deeply concerned about the spiritual state of our country, and still feels a burden to reach more people for Christ. Franklin Graham is leading the effort for pastors and local churches to join this massive outreach.

November 2013, is the key date for this nationwide evangelistic effort, which focuses on local mobilization of Christians across North America. Through this campaign many people will be reached through friendly, relationship evangelism. *My Hope with Billy Graham* is expected to use wide media saturation (television, streaming internet, DVDs, downloadable programs, and mobile platforms). The Association will be developing and updating this site with fresh news, sermon material on prayer and evangelism, and other resources for pastors who want to encourage their congregations in effective relationship evangelism.



Charitable Contributions

A recent decision from the United States Tax Court disallowed a taxpayer's charitable contributions to their church due to an erroneously issued receipt from the church. The details of the case can be read here www.ustaxcourt.gov/InOpHistoric/DurdenMemo.TCM.WPD.pdf. In summary, because the phrase "no goods or services were exchange for these contributions" was not included on the receipt issued by the church the tax court ruled the charitable contributions were nondeductible and assessed tax due and penalties on the tax payer. All receipts for tax deductible gifts should include phasing similar to "no goods or services were exchange for these contributions". The IRS has resources available, www.irs.gov, to assist with charitable contributions; Tax Guide for Churches and Religious Organizations and Publication 256 Charitable Contributions. WANTED:

The Church Planting Commission (CPC) would like to provide a limited number of grants as part of a 2-year-commitment to provide part time pastoral positions (planter, fresh expressions) to work with or alongside current church plants/planters or established churches/pastors. These part time positions are being arranged for and assigned by the CPC and are for church planting ministries or fresh expressions; not for associates to help the pastor maintain what currently exists.

Planters/pastors/churches interested in this offer should forward a detailed written ministry proposal to Bishop Bruce Hill by September 15, 2012. Each written proposal will be considered by the CPC for viability. Interviews will then be held with planters/pastors with acceptable proposals with the final decision being made by the CPC. This is important: this is not a handout; this is an investment in Kingdom ministry and growth.

The CPC will make all final decisions and will arrange for and assign a credentialed EC person that fits the plant/church and appropriate ministry team for each accepted ministry proposal. Please DO NOT go and propose to hire someone!
