You've heard it said, "The Evangelical Congregational Church is connectional." I believe this is one of great strengths of being part of a denomination; we have the ability to work together, to cooperate with each other in order to accomplish things no one pastor or church could do by themselves. Think of some of the ministries you and I participate in because of our connection to the E.C. Church: Evangelical Seminary, our Global Ministries Commission, the StoneRidge campuses, and the camping ministries of Camp ECCO, Rock River, and Twin Pines, just to name a few. We need each other and depend on each other. It's the way the Lord of the church designed it.

Not only do we have the ability to work within the structure of the E.C. Church, but we have opportunities to minister to the greater Kingdom of God and to receive ministry from others in the Kingdom.

Just prior to National Conference, the E.C. Church entered into an agreement with New Church Specialties (NCS) to work together to strengthen the E.C. Church and provide services we could not experience by ourselves. New Church Specialties exists to assist in the starting and strengthening of churches worldwide. One of the things I really like about them, is their definition of church health: "Recapturing the Heart of Jesus for HIS Church." I know you'll be hearing more about that in the coming year. Last year NCS worked with the Great Lakes Region to provide Transitional Interim Pastors Services (TIPS) at Cedarville, IL. This year we are working with them to provide a TIPS pastor for Community Evangelical Church in Sinking Spring. But NCS offers much more than trained interim pastors. NCS provides coaching, consulting and training for churches in three main settings: NewStarts, ReStarts, and ReFocus. NewStarts is pretty much what it sounds like; training and resources for new church planting. Their ReStart resources include training for churches who desire to partner with the denomination to ReStart. NCS has also developed tools for existing churches to use to ReFocus their ministry through a process of assessment, renewal, planning, and implementation.



I am very thank for the team of leaders we have developed within the Evangelical Congregational Church. We have great people with wonderful gifts and graces. I am thankful for partners like New Church Specialties who can help us when we ask. Because of our denomination's relationship with NCS you now have access to many of their resources and information. If you would like to learn more about what NCS has to offer your church you can check out their



News from Benefits Corporation /Compensation Committee

Our health insurance policy renewal continues to be the main focus of attention. To date we have spoken with four health insurance brokers and have received mixed results. It does appear that there will be a couple of health insurance plans that the Benefits Corporation can choose from that, by necessity, most of us will be able to live with. The E.C. Benefits Corporation is aware that there are churches in financial difficulty and that any increase in health insurance premiums will cause havoc within budgets and limit ministry opportunities. As mentioned in last month's EC Leader a change in plan design is inevitable with participants assuming more of their healthcare expenses. The EC Benefits Corp will release information on the health insurance renewal when a decision is made.



The mandatory participation in the group health insurance plan is for pastors only. A pastor's spouse and children are not mandatory participants in our group health plan. The spouse and children of the pastor can seek health insurance coverage elsewhere. The local church is still responsible for covering the cost of health insurance for their pastor and family but the total cost of coverage could be less. A cooperative spirit between the pastor and church board may provide some creative ways to reduce the church's overall health insurance benefit.

Some examples of other healthcare options; children in Pennsylvania can be covered under CHIP, a state run program for uninsured children, I would assume other states have similar programs. A pastor's spouse and children could join one of the faith-based healthcare cost sharing programs available. A younger family (pastor's spouse and children) may find traditional health insurance coverage less expensive than ours. If you do investigate other healthcare options for your spouse and children please do so prayerfully and carefully. Ask lots of questions and read the small print. AllOne Health is again providing our wellness program. We encourage all pastors and spouses to complete their online health assessment, complete two coaching calls with their health coach and a wellness physical from their doctor. Sorry, no incentives this year but your participation will ultimately help the EC Church to be a healthier church.

The Internal Revenue Service increased the standard mile-age reimbursement for business travel to \$.555/mile effective July 1, 2011. Per the compensation committee report we strongly encourage the churches to reimburse pastors at the IRS rate for business miles driven using their personal vehicles.

Japan Disaster Relief Update

Dear Randy,

Thank you so much for your prayers and support.

Tomoyuki and I went to Tohoku from July 25th to 27th and visited churches, Christian groups, and a refugee camp. We gave the funds to several churches, which had a great need of restoring their buildings, and to two Christian networks, which had been working for and supporting churches and refugee camps in Tohoku region. We are planning to send more people from our churches during this summer to help those who have been living in difficulties. We visited the world’s largest tsunami wall in Iwate. Although we were amazed by the length, width, and height of



the wall, we lost our words when we saw that the whole town behind it had been completely swept away by the tsunami of March 11. It will take years to restore those towns along the coast and we believe that the people need the hope that will help them stand up and guide them into the right way.

One of our pastors in Iwate told us that when he was distributing food to people, they asked him why he was so kind to them. The pastor said that he was living out God's love which he had received from Him. The pastor found out that they had never heard about the Lord. He did realize the need of spreading the Gospel but he also acknowledged that there was a lack of workers who could bring spiritual food to unsaved people. There are many towns and villages without a church. Please pray for this mission in Japan.
