Seneca celebrates 35th anniversary

The congregation of Seneca E.C. Church, Seneca, PA celebrated their thirty-fifth anniversary on June 28. The church had its beginnings on March 13, 1974, when Rev. Wilbur Deck of Knox Grace and Rev. Kenneth Shaffer of Knox Bethany met with around 20 interested people at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Donald Schake. The group agreed to meet weekly to study the Bible, learn about the denomination, and consider starting a church.



Soon, the group was meeting twice a week, and by June, they had decided to form a church and affiliate with the Evangelical Congregational denomination. The first public worship service was held on June 30 in the Seneca Fire Hall. Western Conference Superintendent, Fred Fink preached to 253 attendees, and 19 were received into charter membership.

The Conference appointed Rev. John Ward to serve as first pastor, and he began the assignment on July 1. For that month, services were held in the nearby Victory Heights Community Building. For the next four months, the congregation worshipped in a vacant elementary school in Cranberry. In December, they moved to the second floor of Hoover's Tastee Freeze in Cranberry, where they met for the following nine months.

Mr. & Mrs. Rick Montana and Mr. & Mrs. Glenn Weaver donated four acres of land for a building. Rev. Robert Say, a Nazarene evangelist and church builder, was engaged to draw up

plans. A groundbreaking ceremony with Bishop Herbert Wittmaier was held on May 18, 1975.

Rev. Say and a team of volunteers began construction with days. The congregation moved in on August 31, though work remained to be done. A day of dedication was held on February 29, 1976. Rev. Richard Cattermole, Superintendent of the Board of Missions, preached in the morning; Bishop Wittmaier spoke in the afternoon; and Rev. Fred Fink addressed an evening service.

Construction of a fellowship hall/gymnasium began in 2004 under Rev. David Hart. It has been serving both church and community, with some detail work yet to be done.

The celebration on June 28th included a morning message by Bishop Kevin Leibensperger, a service of dedication of the fellowship hall, and a dinner. Current pastor is Joshua Reinders. Wife is Rachel.



Missionary home is occupied
