



Thanks to everyone who has returned the Worker's Compensation audit forms in a timely manner. If you have not returned yours yet, please try to have them returned by February 28, 2023. A simple online reporting form was developed and distributed this year. If you cannot find the link please contact me and we will get it to you. Paper forms, that were used in previous years, are an option as well.

The annual disability premium, \$100, was due January 15, and the Benefit Corporation administrative fee, \$125, is due by April 15, 2023 (retirees are not subject to the administrative fee). Both of these fees are listed in the Treasurer's Guide available on the EC website. Many have remitted the disability fee in a timely manner, and a few have submitted the administrative fee; we thank you for your diligence and hard work.

Treasurers, please begin using the 2023 Ministry Fund forms for January offerings. Offerings collected in December 2022 should be remitted on the 2022 Ministry Fund forms.

Pastoral Compensation Forms

To date only about 50% of pastoral compensation forms have been returned. We will be reminding non-compliant churches to complete and submit their pastoral compensation forms. Please save Dave King some work by submitting your pastoral compensation forms as soon as possible.

Pastors and churches are permitted to obtain health insurance outside of the denominational sponsored plan. If you have obtained health insurance outside of the denominational plan, please be aware of the possible tax consequences and be diligent in the compliance requirements.

403(b) Pension Plan Transition

In Summary:

All of the practical details of moving the ECC 403(b) Pension Plan from Empower Retirement / Prudential to Nationwide are finally known and ready for distribution. The current plan with Empower Retirement / Prudential will enter the blackout period on Thursday, March 16, 2023 and remain in the blackout period until Monday, April 4, 2023. In the blackout period, the plan is frozen with no deposits or withdrawals allowed and no participant reallocation of investments. A blackout period is a standard procedure when plan assets are moved between providers and allows the individual accounts in the plan to maintain a consistent balance for a few days to facilitate an accurate transfer of funds to the new provider.

The assets in the plan are scheduled to be liquidated and transferred out of Empower Retirement/Prudential on March 21, 2023 and be received by Nationwide the next day on March 22, 2023. Nationwide will begin

repurchasing the securities as soon as they are able. As soon as the plan assets are reinvested by Nationwide, all plan participants would be considered "back in the market" receiving interest, dividends and investment gains and losses. Nationwide will take a few days to reconcile the transfer of funds and redistribute the funds and investments back to the individual accounts. At the latest, the plan will come out of the blackout period by Monday, April 4, maybe a day or two sooner. Once the blackout period has ended, the plan will accept contributions, process withdrawals and participants may initiate investment changes.

Churches will begin processing the pension plan contributions by April 4, 2023. Please complete and return the Nationwide Affiliate Set-up form as soon as possible. The last online training session, via Zoom, will be on Tuesday, 2/28, at 6:30 p.m. You can register for the training session by going to https://retirement.eccenter.com and clicking the blue box. If you cannot make Tuesday, 2/28, we will be recording one of the training sessions and posting on our YouTube channel as well as putting an instructional document together.

Conference Support Team Updates

We are starting to rollout the ability to pay your monthly Ministry Funds via an ACH transfer and remit the Ministry Fund report via on online reporting form. A few churches have volunteered to test the ACH remittance process with us as we work out some of the wrinkles. We hope to be able to release the process to all churches by the due date of the March 2023 Ministry Fund payment of April15th.

Since we do not have the funds to develop a custom application, we have built a two-step process:

- Step One: The church will complete the online Ministry Fund report. The online Ministry Fund report will require the treasurer to enter the church name and location, the name and contact information of the person completing the form and the monthly income for the church. The amount of ministry funds due will be calculated. A date is given by the treasurer as to when the funds can be withdrawn from the bank account, a box is checked to authorize the withdraw and then click submit. The Ministry Fund report is sent to Church Center, and a copy is emailed to the contact information on the form. Done. There are no hard copies to send in or Adobe forms to download.
- Step Two: The business office will process an ACH transfer with our online banking software based on the information received on the Ministry Fund form for the amount and date to perform the withdrawal. A precursor to this step will be for the church to provide their banking account information to Church Center to perform the ACH transfer. The banking information will only need to be provided once and will be kept on file.

Mobilizing An Army

A few of the leaders of our denomination have been participating in a cohort learning opportunity to learn how to move to a multiplication mindset as we envision the future of the EC Church and the Kingdom Extension Community. An article a few months ago in the EC Leader looked at the importance of shifting to a multiplication mindset as pastors and church leaders. One of the things that was a challenge in this learning community was moving to a "Home Depot" mindset in terms of the equipping and mobilizing work of the church.

Home Depot has strategically shifted how they communicate their purposes. They still desire to sell building materials and equipment, but they have understood the importance of moving the focus of their advertising from themselves to their customers. In making this shift, they picked up slogans like, "Helping doers get things done" and "You can do it, we can help". What is being communicated in these statements is that Home Depot's desire is not to take advantage of a customer base that can simply accomplish the company's goal of generating revenue, but their hope is to partner with "weekend warriors" to accomplish their goals.

As church leaders, we often find ourselves seeing people as tools to help us accomplish our vision and purposes. Paul challenges this mindset in Ephesians 4 when he says, "So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." The clear design is for church leaders to be equipping the body of Christ to accomplish the things God gives them to accomplish. Church leaders are "equippers" meant not to accomplish our purposes but to release people to accomplish God's purposes for them.

What is God's purpose? To "go and make disciples!" How well are we equipping the members of the body to accomplish those purposes? How well are we mobilizing the army God has brought together in your church for the mission God has for that army? The process of building up the body for mission is daunting at times, but not nearly as impossible as it seems. Often our churches are not accomplishing the mission of God because we have spent countless hours recruiting and developing teams to accomplish our purposes rather than equipping and releasing people to fulfill God's great purpose for each of them.
