## EC Benefits Update

Early indications, not final as of the publishing of the October 2023 *EC Leader*, are that the active pastor's health insurance plan with Guidestone could see a price increase as much as 15% for 2024. A price increase is not unexpected as rates have not increased since January 1, 2022, with a 3% increase from 2021. With the increase in consumer prices we have all experienced, a rate increase is not a big surprise, but the amount of the increase is a shock. The EC Benefits Trustees will be meeting in mid-October to approve the 2024 health insurance plan renewals. There is a possibility that the plan design may change slightly, e.g., higher deductible, to minimize the cost increase. The health insurance renewal decisions of the trustees will be released shortly after the meeting. As reported in the September *EC Leader*, the Highmark Freedom Blue Medicare supplemental plan rates are NOT increasing for 2024. The premium will remain at \$255/person per month pending EC Benefits Trustee approval.

The open enrollment period for the active pastor's health insurance plan with Guidestone begins on November 1. If you would like to or need to join the Guidestone health insurance plan, please contact Kevin Henry or Bethany White prior to December 1 for enrollment information. The plan is open to stationed pastors working at least 30 hours per week and under Medicare eligibility age.

The pastoral compensation committee recommends using the Social Security COLA for the 2024 annual pastor salary increase. If the internet prognosticators are correct, the 2024 Social Security COLA will be around 3.2%. When I researched the 2024 SSA COLA in August, the estimates were less than 3%, so the final increase might be a little higher when it is released. We are all experiencing the same increases in consumer prices, and lay leaders may have received wage and salary increases from their employer to offset the increase in consumer prices. Please prayerfully consider an annual salary increase for your pastor in 2024.

The 2024 Pastoral Compensation Forms will be available on the Church Center website in a few weeks or so. Expect the Social Security Administration to release the 2024 COLA in late October 2023, if we are lucky.

# Savings Certificate Interest Rates

The purpose of the Loan and Investment Fund ("the Fund") per section 416.4 of the EC Discipline, 2022 edition, is, "The money borrowed shall be used to make loans to churches and agencies related to the National Conference for the purchase, construction, renovation, and expansion of physical facilities including parsonages on terms to be fixed by the Loan and Investment Fund Committee. . . " The "money borrowed" are the savings certificates issued by the Loan and Investment Fund Committee. The National Conference borrowed money from individuals, churches and organizations and then loaned those funds to EC Churches and related organizations. In return for loaning funds to the National Conference, the holders of saving certificates receive a semi-annual interest payment. The current interest rate paid on the EC saving certificates is 1.75% compared to most banks and other financial institutions' rate of around 5%. The guestion most often received on The Fund is when will the savings certificate rate be increased? The Loan and Investment Fund Committee has agreed that it is unlikely that the savings certificate rate will be increased.

#### Why?

- Currently the Fund is slightly out of balance. The amount of interest collected on loans is slightly more than the amount of interest paid to certificate holders.
- The purpose of the Fund, per the *EC Discipline*, is to make loans to churches and related organizations. It is not a bank. Commercial banks have multiple revenue streams to fund higher saving interest rates. The Fund has one source of revenue, interest charged on loans. Currently the amount of outstanding saving certificates, \$2.9M, is about twice the amount of outstanding loans, approximately \$1.5M. If the savings certificate interest rate was raised by 1%, a 2% increase in the loan rate would be required.
- To raise loan interest rates to compete with bank saving rates is taking more money from EC Churches and is counterintuitive to one of the goals of the Covenant Implementation, i.e., more funds for local ministry.

The rate of saving certificate redemptions in 2023 is projected to be higher than average. Certificate holders are not required to give a reason for redeeming their certificates, but many have told us they are withdrawing their funds from the Fund to reinvest at higher interest rates elsewhere. We are sorry to lose capital from the Fund but understand the decision.

The Fund committee members believe that the Fund is not going to close or go bankrupt or default on any commitments or not be able to offer new loans. The fund will adjust to meet the future EC Church. We appreciate the certificate holders who continue to partner with us as together we are investing in the growth of the Kingdom.

## **Institute for Church Leadership**

New Testament Survey, October 31 - December 12, 6:30-9:15 p.m.

**Instructor:** Tim Valentino

In this course the student will explore the central meaning and message of the New Testament, showing how Jesus fulfills Old Testament expectations. Attention will be given to the background, setting structure and major themes of the New Testament as a whole. The course will serve as a general introduction to this part of Scripture and provide a list of suggested resources for further study as the course unfolds.

**About the Instructor:** Tim Valentino has been a professor at Evangelical Seminary since 2007, teaching a variety of Bible, theology, pastoral ministry and student writing courses. He presently teaches in the Doctor of Theology and Master of Divinity programs at Kairos University. Tim received his MDiv from Evangelical Seminary and his D.Min. from Southern Seminary in Louisville, KY. He is now finishing his Th.D. degree at Evangelical Seminary. Tim has served in pastoral ministry since 1992 and currently serves as Pastor of Christ Community Church in Myerstown, PA. Tim and his wife, Sonya, reside in Myerstown as well.
