EC Benefits Update

The 2024 Social Security COLA adjustment was released at 3.2%. The Pastoral Compensation Committee recommends pastors receive the annual Social Security COLA increase as approved at the May 2023 national conference. Health insurances rates will be increasing 15% on January 1, 2024. The active pastor's health insurance plan with Guidestone has not increased rates the previous two years. Pension contribution will increase next year at the normal amounts, \$20/mon to \$380/mon for full-time pastors and \$10/mon to \$190/mon for part-time pastors.

The Guidestone plan is changing from a \$1,000 single and \$2,000 family deductible to a \$2,000 single and \$4,000 family deductible plan, however, the HRA benefits will remain the same. The HRA benefit annual maximum out-of-pocket for covered medical expenses, excluding co-pays, remains at \$500 with the HRA paying costs above \$500. The maximum out of pocket for prescriptions and outpatient therapy services (physical therapy,

occupational therapy, speech therapy, respiratory therapy and manipulative therapy) also remains at \$1,800 annually. Participants in the active pastor's health insurance plan will be receiving new ID cards for 2024.

EC Benefits Update

If you have incurred medical expenses above \$500 or prescription or outpatient therapy costs above \$1,800, you may be eligible for reimbursement of your out-of-pocket costs from the HRA. The HRA plan year ends on December 31, 2023, and all requests for reimbursement for the January 2023 - December 2023 plan year must be received by Benecon, our HRA administrator, by March 31, 2024 (ninety days after the end of the plan year). If you need assistance with Benecon, please contact me at the EC Church Center, and I will walk you through the process.

Highmark Freedom Blue

The retiree Medicare supplemental plan, Highmark Freedom Blue, is not increasing for 2024. The premium will remain \$255 per person per month, effective January 1, 2024, with no changes in coverage levels.

For a husband and wife on Freedom Blue, double the above amounts.

The open enrollment period for the Highmark Freedom Blue plan is from October 15, 2023, through December 7, 2023. Retirees enrolled in another Medicare supplemental plan or not in a Medicare supplemental plan may join the Freedom Blue plan only during the open enrollment period. The open enrollment period does not affect pastors that plan on retiring after December 7, 2023. Medicare eligible pastors may join Freedom Blue at the time they superannuate or retire from pastoral service.

It is very important that the retiree does not fall behind on payments to Highmark Freedom Blue. If a retiree is having difficulty paying the monthly premium, the Manna Fund is available for financial assistance. There are many Medicare Advantage plans available, even some at no cost to the participant. However, each plan will have positives and negatives in terms of participating providers and benefits provided. Please thoroughly investigate a Medicare Advantage plan before switching plans. If a retiree does not have the financial means to assume a larger portion of the Freedom Blue plan, the Manna Fund is available to financially assist the retiree.

<u>Manna Fund</u>

The Manna Fund was established to assist our retired clergy and surviving spouses with financial needs. The income limits to qualify for a Manna Fund distribution were recently changed to 200% of the federal poverty level as defined by the US Department of Health and Human Services; the 2023 Manna Fund income limits are \$29,160 for a single and \$39,440 for a couple. If you are aware of any of our retired clergy or surviving spouses that could benefit from a Manna Fund distribution, please encourage them to complete an application for assistance. Manna Fund applications were mailed to retired clergy and surviving spouses in October and an application may also be requested from the EC Church Center.

EC Benefits Update

We are guickly approaching the end of the calendar year, and we are encouraging all the local church pastors, treasurers or administrators to begin planning for the required year-end reporting. Required reporting includes year-end tax forms, giving statements, denomination annual reports and pastoral compensation forms. A small amount of preparation and planning early in the process will save time and frustration later. Due dates for year-end reporting:

Please note the earlier filing deadlines of W-2s and 1099 – NEC/MISC forms: Form W-2 (pastors and church employees) January 31, 2024 Filed with Social Security - January 31, 2024 (paper and electronic forms)

Form 1099-NEC/MISC (independent contractors) January 31, 2024 Filed with IRS - January 31, 2024 (paper and electronic forms)

Pastors are employees of the local church and should receive a W-2 with federal, state and local taxes withheld from every paycheck.

God Uses a Gift and a Letter to Change Lives

As a 7-year-old in Mongolia, Jargalmaa (pictured left) described one particular day as "unexpected." After school, her teacher invited her to a church where she received her very first gift! This Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift included, among other fun toys, stationery, and a set of hairclips. Inside, she also found a letter that said, "You are valuable and so loved by God." Jargalmaa cherished this message because her parents and grandparents had never told her that they loved her.

Jargalmaa went on to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program where she especially appreciated the lessons about God as Creator. Later in 10th grade, she accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior. Through her testimony, five of her family members and two close friends also made this life-changing decision.

Now 15 years after receiving her shoebox gift, Jargalmaa, her husband, and two young children have recently moved to a new community where they are ministering to youth in hopes of starting a church.

"I would like to challenge people who are preparing shoebox gifts to also write a letter showing God's love," Jargalmaa said. "What's written there may be very simple, but those simple words could completely change somebody's life."

Believing In Prayer

Last month I told you we were going to be meeting our EC Church planters. We will continue to introduce you to them, but I wanted to pause to encourage you to pray. I believe God wants to make the EC Church a dynamic movement of God as Bishop Randy has been faithfully reminding us, but as he shared at the recent NMT meeting, that movement must be birthed in prayer.

Allow me to share a short story with you. In January of 2023, my congregation began looking for a children's ministry director. We did all the things you should do in the process. We updated the job description. We sent out notices to the EC Church family. We advertised to local colleges and universities. We even sent messages to other local churches to see if they had individuals who would be interested. Then we waited... and waited some more. We made excuses for the difficulty of hiring for such a specific part-time position. Still, after months of waiting, we had not found the right candidate for the job.

At a leadership team meeting in September, we felt God's conviction that we needed to pray fervently and boldly for God to provide.

Don't get me wrong, we had prayed for Him to provide: it was part of Sunday morning prayers; it was part of prayer lists we had sent out; but in this meeting, we felt God was asking us to pray boldly. One individual prayed that God would supply this person within a week. We trusted God, and within a week, we had three individuals who reached out to apply for the job. Two were very qualified and even then, God moved in one of these individuals to withdraw her application, and He made it clear who we should hire!

Why do I share this with you? I am not suggesting that when we pray "the right way," God will give us whatever we want. God is not a cosmic gumball machine or supernatural Santa. But He invites us to boldly come before His throne in prayer (Heb. 4:16). In this boldness, we are seeking God's grace and provision and trusting in His perfect plans. James tells us we have not because we ask not (James 4:2). When our motives are aligned with God's heart, He invites us to boldly ask, and He will provide according to his will.

Would you consider adopting one or two of our church planters as a prayer partner? Would you begin to seek God's heart for them in prayer? Would you pray fervently and boldly for them? Would you take a day a month and fast on their behalf (giving up something good to seek after something great)?

New Testament Survey, October 31 – December 12, 6:30-9:15 p.m.

Instructor: Tim Valentino

In this course the student will explore the central meaning and message of the New Testament, showing how Jesus fulfills Old Testament expectations. Attention will be given to the background, setting structure and major themes of the New Testament as a whole. The course will serve as a general introduction to this part of Scripture and provide a list of suggested resources for further study as the course unfolds.

About the Instructor: Tim Valentino has been a professor at Evangelical Seminary since 2007, teaching a variety of Bible, theology, pastoral ministry and student writing courses. He presently teaches in the Doctor of Theology and Master of Divinity programs at Kairos University. Tim received his M.Div. from Evangelical Seminary and his D.Min. from Southern Seminary in Louisville, KY. He is now finishing his Th.D. degree at Evangelical Seminary. Tim has served in pastoral ministry since 1992 and currently serves as Pastor of Christ Community Church in Myerstown, PA. Tim and his wife, Sonya, reside in Myerstown as well.
