

Thanks to everyone who has returned the Worker's Compensation audit forms in a timely manner. If you have not returned yours yet, please try to have them returned by February 28, 2024. A simple online reporting form was developed and distributed this year. If you cannot find the link please contact me, and we will get it to you. Paper forms, that were used in previous years, are an option as well.

The annual disability premium, \$100, was due January 15, and the Benefit Corporation administrative fee, \$125, is due by April 15, 2024; retirees are not subject to the administrative fee. Both of these fees are listed in the Treasurer's Guide available on the EC website. Many have remitted the disability fee in a timely manner, and a few have submitted the administrative fee. We thank you for your diligence and hard work.

Treasurers, please begin using the 2024 Ministry Fund forms for January offerings. Offerings collected in December 2023 should be remitted on the 2023 Ministry Fund forms.

#### Pastoral Compensation Forms

To date, only about 50% of pastoral compensation forms have been returned. We will be reminding non-compliant churches to complete and submit their pastoral compensation forms. Please save Bethany White some work by submitting your pastoral compensation forms as soon as possible.

Pastors and churches are permitted to obtain health insurance outside of the denominational sponsored plan. If you have obtained health insurance outside of the denominational plan, please be aware of the possible tax consequences and be diligent in the compliance requirements.

I have received a few complaints when contacting Nationwide and have clarified phone numbers. In the Nationwide structure, our plan is considered a Bundled Plan since each church has a separate plan that is bundled together under EC Benefits Corporation. There are multiple phone numbers on Nationwide websites and forms, but pastors and participants should call 1-877-588-6724 with questions. If you do not receive a satisfactory answer, please contact Kevin or Bethany at the EC Church Center. We have a plan contact that we can reach out to on your behalf. Also, contact EC Church Center if you are in need of a Nationwide form. There are specific forms for Bundled Plans, and we can submit the form on your behalf and follow up in a few weeks if something is not done correctly. Church Treasurers should always contact the EC Church Center with questions or problems. Our Nationwide contact, Cindy Davis, was only responsible for the implementation of the plan and is not available as an ongoing resource.

# Free Money Is Going Fast - \$10,000 \$8,000 \$6,000!

We have once again partnered with the National Association of Evangelicals (NAE) to offer Pastoral Financial Health and Church Generosity training. To encourage participation in the financial health training a grant of \$10,000 \$6,000 is available for cash gifts upon completion of a training module and the training is open to all paid pastoral or ministerial individuals employed by an EC Church. The pastor/minister may be full time or part time (no minimum hours), serve as the lead, senior, associate, assistant, youth, outreach or in a music ministry, these positions are all eligible to take the training and receive a cash gift. If you have completed the financial health training previously (2019 – 2021) you are not eligible to receive a second cash gift. The offer of a cash gift expires on December 31, 2024. The cash gifts are made available by the generosity, vision, and ministry of the Lilly Endowment in partnership with the NAE.

To receive a \$250 cash gift, a pastor must complete one of the Pastoral Financial Health modules at, <a href="https://naefinancialhealth.online/">https://naefinancialhealth.online/</a>. Scroll down the page and select "Create Account." On the next page, enter your information and from the drop-down box of participating denominations select us, Evangelical Congregational Church. On the next page select one module from the six session Personal Finances Course. Once the module is completed, I will receive an email that the class was completed and send the registered participant the financial gift.

A second \$250 grant will be awarded for the completion of a second module in the Personal Financial Health course. A maximum of \$500 in grants will be awarded per participant. Each training can be completed in 60 to 90 min, and these grants are tax free.

The \$250 grant is also available to a pastor that completes the Church Generosity training with their church leadership. The pastor and church leadership are required to complete the Church Generosity class together. The grant for completing the training is only available for the pastor and will be paid to the pastor. The maximum cash award is \$500 per pastor, and a combination of completed training between the Personal Finances Course and the Church Generosity training is allowed.

# Conference Support Team Update

The EC Church Center implemented a new donor management system called Neon. With Neon we have increased functionality, capability and modernity at a lower cost. No system is perfect, but it is better than what we had.


The first feature most individuals will notice are the new Global Ministries and Kingdom Extension Community giving pages linked to our website. The giving pages have a modern look and functionality that the previous system did not. Also, there is an option to create a login. Regular donors are encouraged to create a login. A login will allow donors to store bank account or credit card information and access their giving history. There is a new VOLUNTARY option to donate an additional amount to cover credit card and bank processing fees. Most non-profits organizations have added this feature to their online giving pages. Donations ARE NOT REDUCED by the processing fees. These fees are an operating cost funded by unrestricted income.

Giving receipts will look different and will be delivered electronically in most instances. Donors over the years have requested hard copy mailed statements, and we will continue to mail hard copy statements as needed. If requested, year-end statements may be mailed or delivered electronically.

Email communication will be through Neon. You should have noticed a different look to mass emails and some of the difficulties we had with undeliverable or spam email messages should be reduced.

Another new feature we are evaluating is SMS text messages. Text messaging, just like email, that is used more frequently than the recipient thinks necessary will diminish the effectiveness of the message. We are working through a standard practice policy to use text messaging judiciously along with a text messaging enrollment process.

# Prepare for Rain!

One of my favorite Christian-themed movies has long been *Facing the Giants* (2006, Sherwood Pictures). Those of you who have seen it will remember a character named Mr. Bridges. He is an older gentleman who walks the hallways of the high school, praying over the lockers of every student. In one scene, he encounters the discouraged football coach. He tells a story about two farmers who, in the midst of a drought, pray for rain. But only one of the farmers prepared his fields to receive the rain when it came. Mr. Bridges then asks the coach which of the farmers had more faith. Of course, the answer is the one who prepared his fields. Mr. Bridges reminds the coach that God will bring the rain when He is ready, but the coach had better prepare his fields in the meantime.

In conversations we have had over the past couple of months with District Field Directors and pastors, there are a few common struggles we share. Many of our churches have no young families, children or youth. Some see very few first-time guests and have had a very difficult time reaching their changing community. Like the farmers in Mr. Bridges' story, we are all praying that God would bring growth (1 Corinthians 3:7). If suddenly a local family is moved to visit the church, and we are not prepared to receive them, it is unlikely they will return the following week. The Church Health Community is here to help you prepare your fields. We can offer suggestions for establishing a plan which can be enacted on short notice. In some cases "preparing fields" may include designating volunteers and space for children's ministry without a guarantee that it will be immediately fruitful but will be available so that when families with children do come, they will be blessed and recognize how they are valued, wanting to return and be more connected.

If neighbors visiting for the first time is a rare occurrence, please consider a recommendation. Thom Rainer's book *Becoming a Welcoming Church* (2018, B&H) is a thorough and useful guide to being ready to receive guests in the church. It is an easy read and makes a great study for the leadership team in any church, regardless of size. The Church Health Community also has a workshop called *The Church's Front Door* which is designed to help increase the likelihood of our meeting first-timers on Sunday mornings.

We also encourage churches within districts to share resources. If there is one strong children's or youth ministry within proximity to your church, is there a way you can participate? Christian Endeavor even invites churches with no youth in their church to participate in their programs so that they will be ready when God brings young people.

In the movie, the coach rededicates himself to the team, and they ultimately overcome odds stacked against them. As a dynamic movement of God, we are expecting God to do great things in our churches. We join you in praying for Him to move and bless your ministry. Together, let us prepare for rain! # **Prayer Network Update**

February 2024

In a Nahua village in Mexico a couple's son became very ill. They took him to several clinics in Mexico City and also to witchdoctors seeking a cure. But none came. They then met two local pastors who are Samaritan's Purse ministry partners with Operation Christmas Child. They prayed for the boy—and God healed him! The family then gave their lives to Christ and became the first believers in their community.

Unfortunately, this family now faces many forms of persecution for their faith. But that hasn't stopped them from reaching out to their neighbors. They recently invited our ministry partners to hold an Operation Christmas Child outreach in their home. They plan to invite 50 children from their village. They pray it will create goodwill and open a door for a larger shoebox event next year.

Ministry training is currently underway. Please pray for the Nahua people and for our teams as they approach families with invitations and prepare to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with them through shoebox gifts.

# Meet Our Planters - Zach and Kelsey VanDyke

### Tell us about your family:

Kelsey and I have been married for 14 years (15 on November 21st!) and have three kids: Kaitlynn (12), Levi (almost 10), and Shiloh (7).

Kelsey loves music and to play guitar and sing. She is also a great fan of puzzles of all sorts: logic, math, actual puzzles. I also love music and love to play bass and drums. Our mutual love for music is actually how we met, playing on worship team of the church we were attending. I am an avid reader who almost always has multiple books going at the same time. My home library is probably close to about 400 books at this point.



Kelsey works full-time for a safety consulting company in Bettendorf, Iowa. Her job varies from payroll to proof-reading and just about anything in-between. In 2020, her role allowed me to step away from full-time employment to focus on school and ministry. She loves what she does and is quite good at it. It plays right into some of her best giftings, particularly administration. My job at this point is being a student, pastor of two churches (the other being Calvary E.C. Church in Hooppole, Illinois), father and husband.

Our kids are obsessed with Minecraft—odds are they are playing it if they are doing anything. Levi has a sharp intellect with a natural curiosity for building and seeing how things work. Shiloh loves to be around her siblings doing what they do. Kaitlynn inherited my love for reading and is actively involved in The Axios Community Outpost. As a family, we enjoy eating around our table together, horsing around and, in general, spending time with each other at our home.

#### Tell us about your church planting vision:

The Axios Community Outpost (T.A.C.O., for short) began, in some ways, on accident. Kelsey and I had former students asking us (separately and at different times over about a six-month period) for help navigating their questions about God. We opened our house to these young adults to give them a space to ask their questions freely, openly, and bluntly with a commitment to digging into them together. Our goal was not to start a church, but through opening our home to them, sharing a meal regularly, and creating an intentional atmosphere of exploring who God is and how to relate to Him and be representative of Him, a church has started. We started with six people who did not live with us. That number quickly dropped to three. As of right now, if everyone is able to attend on a given weekend (which, as they are young adults trying to figure out bills, school/work/life balance, etc. is not always possible), we would have 13 people. Everyone who has come in has come in because one of the three that are still with us brought them along. Our goal as a church is to be a community for people to wrestle openly and honestly through their faith, discipling them through their questions and training them to do the same thing for the people in their neighborhoods. We are anticipating that we will have a second home church going before the end of 2024.

It seems the general rule is to have a "target audience" for ministry. In a way, we do. But ours is truly open to any who are interested. Kelsey and I both have a heart for those who have experience with the church, those who

do not and especially for those whose experience with the church has left them feeling hurt and dechurched. If we had a specific audience, that would be it. Because we have been there ourselves and understand the value of being heard, we aim to be people that others can come to and be heard without fear of reprisal or shame.

**Haitian Church Plant** – Chezaire and Laurel Dominique have begun meeting with a leadership team to pray and seek God's vision for a Haitian church. Please pray as God continues to gather the planting team, He gives them a specific vision for the future and energizes them for this task. The team has a lead on a church building; pray that God works out the details for this possibility to become a reality.

**Manuel and Luz Arias in Lexington, South Carolina** – The Arias family is starting a new EC Church. Manuel and Luz are developing a team for ministry, as well as strategizing ways to share the Gospel in tangible ways. Please pray that God would provide a location for this church to use for worship gatherings. Pray also for wisdom, strength, and renewed energy for this couple.

**The Reams** – Tim and Pam Ream have moved to Thorn Hill, Tennessee. They are pursuing the opportunity to engage in planting an EC Church in their new community. Pray that God would begin preparing that community to be receptive to His glorious presence. Pray also for the Reams as they begin building relationships and engaging in discipleship relationships through inviting people into their home and engaging individuals in their community.


