
The Whole Gospel

hen we hear the word 'gospel' many of us immediately think of John 3:16, "For God loved the world so much that he gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life." Is that the Gospel, the Good News? Yes, but there's so much more to it than that one verse. Someone recently said to me, after I had preached, that they were surprised that I had preached from the Old Testament and that it was a Gospel message. It was almost like in their mind the Gospel had nothing to do with the first half of the Bible. Maybe you've heard people express the thought that since the coming of Jesus and the start of the church we don't care about the old ways in the Old Testament. The 21st Century American mind says "that's all history and who likes history?" "We want something for today."

I'm afraid that as followers of Jesus we have, too often, read the Bible in a fragmented way; never really connecting the entire story of Good News. I remember, as a pastor, talking with a young adult who had never put together that the baby Moses in the bulrushes was the very same Moses in the Exodus "let my people go" story. To her these were enjoyable but separate Bible stories. If that's one person's experience just with Moses, what's the view of many other faithful church attendees? Do any of the hundreds of Bible stories connect and make sense as one overarching story of the Good News, of God's deep desire to live in relationship with humanity?

Recently, I have watched with interest a growing conversation about the Gospel. Years ago Billy Graham called for a diverse congress to re-frame Christian mission in a world of social, political,

economic, and religious upheaval. The Church, he believed, had to apply the Gospel to the contemporary world, and to work to understand the ideas and values behind rapid changes in society. In July 1974 some 2,700 participants and guests from over 150 nations gathered in Lausanne, Switzerland. The result of that historic gathering was the Lausanne Covenant. One of the lines of that Covenant was that we must take "...the whole Gospel to the whole world." I like that phrase, "the whole Gospel." The whole Bible is the whole Gospel. The Good News started in Genesis with the reality that God wanted to live in relationship with his creation (that's us) and that is not a story, it is the story. It is the story of a God of grace; the God who speaks; the God who acts; the God who listens; the God who loves; the God who atones. What is perhaps even more amazing is that that same God is doing all those things today! He continues to seek relationship with humanity. Scot McKnight in his book The King Jesus Gospel states, "The Gospel is to declare something about a Person, about God in his revelation in Jesus Christ and about what God has done in Jesus Christ." In embracing the Gospel we must embrace the whole story.

The highlight of this conference will be the transition of the now part-time Field Superintendent to a full-time Director in the next stage of ECCM's development of becoming a National Conference.

• India—April 17-26, 2012. DGM Rev. Randy Sizemore will be traveling with Bishop Bruce Hill, Dr. Gordon Lewis and India/Nepal Committee Chair, Rev. David Swift to the General Conference sessions of the EC Church of India. The highlight of this conference will be the election of the next

Short Term Mission Representative added to GMC:

Mr. Tim King, from Mohn's Hill EC, was added to the Commission as the Short Term Missions Representative. Tim's 11 years of experience serving as Director of Ministries for a local youth discipleship and evangelism ministry, called DRAMA Ministry (www.dramateam.org) and his extensive experience leading both international and national short term mission trips will be a great resource to the GMC and our local churches as we continue to help create global-minded Christians by exposing them to short term mission opportunities both at home and abroad.

Mission Minded Kids Rally Update:

The spring MMK Rally was held at Boyertown
Trinity EC with 82 children, 79 adults and 14 teens
who were given a hands-on mission project in the
local community. The VBS lessons for 2012-2013
and the VBS mission moments will focus on our EC
Church of India. The VBS project will be to help
replace the dilapidated security fence around the ECCI campus.



The Mission Conference in Costa Rica comes to an end on June 1, 2012:

After a three year comprehensive evaluation of the work in Costa Rica in consultation with the Latin America Committee, previous GMC Directors and Bishop Hill, the GMC has made the decision to discontinue the work in Costa Rica effective June 1, 2012. We would encourage those who were faithfully supporting the work to consider reallocating their financial and prayer support to one of the other international EC church mission conferences. The GMC Task Force findings:

The task force organized by the National Ministry Team and charged with examining the breadth and scope of the GMC and its finances has completed their work and made several recommendations to the Global Ministries Commission and the National Ministry Team. The NMT will take the task force's findings into consideration as they continue the work of strategic planning for the EC Church. The GMC has acted on several of the task force's internal recommendations including:



- 1. The voluntary "Thank Offering" funds will be re-designated from the current purpose described in Rules of Conference section 704.3.2 as missionary benevolence and office staffing to be used as a source of income support for our international EC Church mission conferences. Currently there is no regular designated income stream to help support our international EC churches. The other GMC offerings will remain as listed.
- 2. While we will continue our policy of only sending to our international churches the funds we are able to raise, the GMC will set an annual budget or target amount for each mission conference and when one conference's target has been reached, any excess funds received will be allocated to a mission conference that has not yet meet its target, and so on until all of our international EC church mission conferences have met their funding targets. This will help us achieve a more equitable support strategy for our international EC churches.
- 3. The GMC will begin applying 5% assessment on all funds coming through GMC, <u>excluding missionary support</u>, to help fund the administration and operation of the GMC office.
- 4. Since the GMC is not supported through National Conference Ministry Funds, we will continue to invite churches and individuals to regularly support the administration and operation of the GMC office through the general fund.

News from Benefits/Compensation

We're just around the corner from the National Conference. It is a wonderful opportunity to get some face to face time with the people involved in providing and maintaining your benefits. 2011 had some notable changes taking effect mostly in 2012, and with change comes questions. While a lot of effort has been made to anticipate those questions and provide the information up front, it is not possible to foresee all of the variables in a group such as ours. The Healthy Pastors Task Force, Power Kunkle (our new benefits consultants), Prudential Securities and the Benefits Corporation will be in attendance at National Conference.
