

We don't know a lot about the woman named Martha in the New Testament, but it seems clear that she was a woman who loved and believe in Jesus. She lived in the town of Bethany with her sister Mary and their brother Lazarus. Luke tells us that Martha was the practical sister who loved Jesus but also saw all the work that needed to be done; she was the hostess of the family.

The Bible tells us Lazarus became ill and died. Four days later the traditional Jewish grieving process was in full force with relatives, friends, and people from nearby Jerusalem gathered to mourn his death.

When Jesus arrived at the home and nearby tomb Martha went out to meet him. The conversation between Jesus and Martha is instructive. First she addresses him as




"Lord"; recognizing his authority and power. Then she witnesses to her belief in his power saying, "If only you had been here, my brother would not have died." Martha believed in the healing power of Jesus. Then goes on stating she knows Jesus is a powerful man of God; that God "will give you whatever you ask." Jesus responds with a word of comfort, "Your brother will rise again." Martha responds, "Yes, he will rise when everyone else rises, at the last day." Martha took lesus statement that Lazarus would rise again as words of

comfort; Jesus meant them to describe what he would do.

Then the conversation of comfort takes a strange turn as Jesus states, "I am the resurrection and the life." Jesus takes a doctrine she believes and turns it into faith in a person—in him. Jesus could have said "I can raise Lazarus from the dead" and then did it and Martha would have been very happy. But what he said was "I am the resurrection." Jesus could have said that he could give life. But instead he said, "I am...the life."

According to God's Word there have been others who have raised dead people to life: Elijah (1 Kings 17), Elisha (2 Kings 4), Peter (Acts 9), and Paul (Acts 20). So what's the difference with Jesus? Jesus is saying that he alone is the embodiment of the power over death and life and he proved that when he rose from the grave that first Easter Sunday morning. No one needed to be there; Jesus conquered death and lives today.

Because Jesus is the resurrection and the life, anyone who believes in him has eternal life that transcends physical death. Jesus said, "Everyone who lives in me and believes in me will never ever die." Finally, Jesus asks Martha, "Do you believe this?"

Easter is more than a holiday, more than a holy day. Faith, to be real, must be personal. It must be my heart's relationship with a personal Savior, Jesus who is himself God, who is himself the resurrection and the life. Do you believe this?

News from BENEFITS CORPORATION

Thanks to almost everyone for completing the **workers compensation** forms on a timely basis. The workers compensation audit is scheduled and the invoices will be sent to the churches by mid April. Early estimates indicate there will be decrease to the workers compensation premiums and all churches in the group workers compensation program will see a decrease in their premiums.

Churches not included in the denominational workers compensation group policy; Ohio, Illinois and Kentucky churches, however your individual state mandates workers compensation coverage. Please confirm that all employees of the church are covered by workers compensation insurance. Per EC Benefits Corporation policy H.3.b, churches not covered by the denomination group workers compensation policy shall submit proof of workers compensation coverage to:

The **annual disability premium** was due January 15 and the Benefit Corporation administrative fee is due by April 15, 2017, <u>retirees are not subject to the administrative fee</u>. Both of these fees are listed in the Treasurer's Guide available on the EC website. Many have remitted the disability fee timely and a few have submitted the administrative fee and we thank you for your diligence and hard work.

Treasurers please confirm that you are remitting your **ministry fund** payments on the correct monthly form. In 2017 the ministry fund percentage decreased to 7.33%.

To date only about 70% of the **pastoral compensation forms** have been returned. Thanks to all the churches that have responded. We will be reminding non compliant churches to complete and submit their pastoral compensation forms. Please save Dave King some work by submitting your pastoral compensation forms as soon as possible.

News from MINISTERIAL DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY

Over the past decade, the leadership of the EC Church has been learning some valuable and critical lessons about how to move forward with ministry in our current cultural climate. Our theological framework is mining new depths that are surrounded by some resurging biblical concepts—discipleship, missionality, gospel, kingdom, ecclesiology, etc. These terms carry definitions that are helpful to ministry in our present circumstances, and they are not going away.

Our whole system from denominational leadership to pastor to congregation is working through a significant learning curve. Some might be inclined to tune out the dissonance caused by the arrival of these terms and their developing understandings. Some have wondered what is so significant about these concepts. Others may have wondered if there will ever be a place to explore these and move in the same direction that the EC Church is going.

The Ministerial Development Community is working with Evangelical Seminary to develop a Center for EC Studies. The primary focus for this center is to help new applicants for ministry and transfers from other denominations receive an orientation in things that are a part of this ongoing EC



conversation. The good news is that each offering will be open to anyone seeking to understand, catch up, or refine his or her understandings about our EC culture and language.

This Center for EC Studies will offer brief educational units for understanding such things as Bible interpretation, worldview, mission, Christian posture, the Gospel, Arminian theology, ecclesiology, covenant theology, and eschatology taught from a basic EC perspective. Our hope is to start providing offerings at a reasonable cost this Fall in a classroom setting at Evangelical Seminary with the capability of online viewing and interaction. Each offering will be uniquely designed—such as involvement over one or two weekends of intensive study and dialogue, or stretching over a few weeks with reading assignments and classroom discussion, or involving a panel discussion among theologians for a few hours.
