- Missionary Speaking Engagements: With travel restrictions many plans for international missionaries to be on furlough in the states are tentative. - College Campus Ministries: Many of our college campus ministries have encountered some decline in student engagement despite many campuses opening back up for in-person instruction this semester. Pray for encouragement for our EC missionaries serving college ministries and for fresh vision to encounter, engage, and disciple college students around the world despite current COVID-related restrictions and low student engagement. - Lausanne Church Planting Update & Praise Report: Maasai chiefs saw God send them rain in response to their prayers. "Simba, a co-worker, in the Lausanne Church planting network was summoned by the Maasai tribal leaders to a meeting of the chiefs. He was then asked to start the meeting with prayer to his God. He had noticed the drought in



the region and the effect it was having on cattle and farming. With a God-given boldness he asked all to stand and call out to the God of heaven for rain to fall that very day. Within hours God opened the skies and a torrential rain fell on the assembly. The chiefs, astounded by the power of Simba's God, responded by falling to their knees in the mud and rain. God is showing his grace on the tribe of 2 million. Pray that the whole tribe will come to Christ in what is known as a 'peoples movement.'" (Shared by Ron Anderson, ECMI.)



Sensitive to the regional diversity of culture, the Evangelical Congregational work in India exists primarily in the state of Manipur, located in the hills of Northeast India, and ministers to the local tribal groups whose traditions are closely related to the Burmese (Myanmar) culture. About 35% of the local Manipur population is Christian and Christ's movement in the region is unmistakable

On May 15th, 2020 in Churachandpur, Rev. Paozathang Singson took office for a four-year term as the new General Director of the EC Church of India. Rev. Singson has served as a missionary with ECCI in Bhutan and Arunachal, India, and has also served as the Missions Director in the ECA presbytery. Rev. Singson taught as a lecturer for our Evangelical College of Theology for a few years. Despite many churches in the region being relegated to having only online services since March 2020, the churches in the "hilly country" were able



to carry on as normal which provided Rev. Singson the ability to fellowship with them. In the midst of a country-wide lockdown, Rev. Singson has been able to visit all the presbytery offices that make up ECCI and even organized a fellowship time for the leaders of the presbyteries to share and encourage one another through the pandemic.

We are excited by the zeal we see and read about among our EC brothers and sisters in Northeast India. They truly have a heart to see their people hear the Good News about Jesus. Please continue to pray for them as they sacrifice much to take God's Word to neighboring states and countries.
