# From the Bishop

I don't know if you've ever had to write an article for a newsletter like the EC LEADER or maybe a report for school, but there's that moment when you realize you can't put it off any longer and you have to write something. People used to talk about sitting and staring at that blank piece of white paper in the type-

writer; today I sit and stare at a white rectangle on my



screen. I'm in an introspective mood. You see, it has occurred to me that I am at the half-way point of my term as bishop of the Evangelical Congregational Church.

Serving as bishop gives me a unique perspective of church life. The longer I serve as bishop the more disconnected Gloria and I become from our home church because of the responsibilities of being bishop. We read articles and news items about ministries going on at church, we see new names, and, when we get there, we see new faces. Those are all good things, but they remind us that we're not very ac-

tively involved in that local congregation any more. Now before you go to feeling badly for the bishop and his wife let me share another perspective.

Being bishop for two and a half years means that we have had the opportunity to meet with many of the local congregations who make up the EC Church family. By my count I have preached and/or visited in 72 of our congregations here in the USA. (If I haven't been at your church yet, you might as well call Church Center and invite me before I invite myself.) While Gloria comes along

on most trips in the USA. she's missed

out on joining me in the worship experiences in Northeast India and Liberia. So what have we discovered? We've found that our churches are very much the same while also being very different. We've met lots of babies, children, teens, young couples, middle aged couples and older folks. Yes, the EC Church has them all. We participated in services that

were in English, in services that were in Spanish, and in services that were a combination of the two. We have congregations in big fancy buildings

and in simple facilities. We even have



congregations who don't have buildings of their own. There are churches that sing traditional hymns, some use contemporary music, and some blend the two. We've been to locations where most people wore dresses or coats and ties, and to places where jeans and shorts were in the majority. While many of us are aware of our denomination's Pennsylvania German heritage the EC Church of the 21st Century is made up of many colors and cultures. We are a diverse group of people who are all following Jesus!

You know, that's why lesus came to earth. Jesus came to offer life to the world; every language, every color, people of every age. Christmas is a time for family, our natural family and

# **Great Lakes Region Meeting**

# **Missionary Christmas Gifts:**

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAILING GIFTS/MONEY TO MIS-SIONARIES:

- If the missionary is currently serving in the USA or is in the USA on furlough, you can send your gift, check and card directly to them. Contact the GMC office if you need a current address.
- If the missionary is serving overseas, please send the check to the Global Ministries office made payable to EC Church with a note in the memo line or a note detailing which missionary(ies) are to receive funds and the amounts. You can mail a Christmas card directly to the missionary; again, contact us if you need to check an address.
- DO NOT include a check in a Christmas card and mail it to GMC; we cannot forward Christmas cards overseas. DO NOT mail a check directly overseas unless a missionary has specifically instructed you to do so; it usually costs quite a bit to cash checks overseas, and there are many check-altering schemes that could wind up emptying your bank account.
- Many countries will charge customs duty on any packages sent, so check with the missionary first to see if they want or can use what you intend to send.

A couple of end of the year reminders:

- Pastor Compensation Forms should be returned to David King, Benefits Administrator, along with a copy to the Conference Minister by January 15, 2014.
- Annual Statistical Report due to Rev. Ken Wiest, Statistician, EC Church Center, 100 West Park Avenue, Myerstown, PA 17067 by January 25, 2014.
- W-2 forms for employees (incl. pastors) and 1099-MISC forms for independent contractors are due by January 31 to the recipient and February 28 to the respective government agency or March 31 if filed electronically.

The aggregate cost of all applicable employer provided health insurance is to be reported on 2013 W-2s issued in January 2014. EC Benefits will provide the amounts to report on 2013 W-2s. The cost of employer provided health insurance is not a taxable benefit. This is informational reporting only.

Pastors are employees of the local church and should receive a W-2 with federal, state and local taxes withheld from every paycheck.

The rates for the active pastor health insurance plan will increase on January 1, 2014. The new rates are payable on December 15, 2013. The new health insurance rates are:

 HRA reimbursements under the active pastors Highmark Blue Shield plan are due to PrimePay by December 29, 2013 for covered healthcare expenses incurred by September 30, 2013. This is an HRA rule regardless of the insurance carrier. Reimbursements not received by December 29 will not be paid. No exceptions.

There will be an increase in the cost of the retiree Medicare supplemental plan, Highmark Freedom Blue, of \$17 per month to \$188 per month. There are no changes to benefit levels. Your invoices for January 2014 will reflect the increase in premium cost.
