

or call 717-866-7581 + The **Annual Treasurer's Guide** and **2023 Ministry Fund Forms** will be on the members section of the EC website shortly. Please remember *the EC Benefits service fee is \$125/yr due by March 15, 2023, and the \$100/yr disability fee is due by January 15, 2023.* The service fee offsets the cost of the annual financial audit, directors & officers insurance and other operating costs of EC Benefits Corporation that more and more often includes professional fees as employee benefits become more complex.

The **Pastoral Compensation Forms** are updated and posted on the website.

There is going to be an accelerated schedule for returning **Workers Compensation Payroll** information. We are waiting on the final details from the audit firm employed by Church Mutual, but anticipate a mid-January deadline for returning the workers compensation information. To make returning the information easier we are developing an online reporting tool for the Workers Compensation Payroll data. More information will be released shortly.

+ The **HRA plan year** ends on December 31, 2022 and all requests for reimbursement for the January 2022 - December 2022 plan year must be received by Benecon, our HRA administrator, by March 31, 2023, ninety days after the end of the plan year. This is an HRA rule regardless of the insurance carrier. Reimbursements received after March 31 will not be paid. No exceptions.

### + Highmark Freedom Blue Retiree Plan

The retiree Medicare supplemental plan, Highmark Freedom Blue, remains the same at \$255 per person per month, effective January 1, 2023, with minor changes in coverage levels.

For a husband and wife on Freedom Blue double the amounts above.

It is very important that the retiree does not fall behind on payments to Highmark Freedom Blue. If a retiree is having difficulty paying the monthly premium the Manna Fund is available for financial assistance. Please contact David King in the EC Benefits office for a Manna Fund application.

There are many Medicare Advantage plans available even, some at no cost to the participant. However, each plan will have positives and negatives in terms of participating providers and benefits provided. Please thoroughly investigate any Medicare Advantage plan before switching plans. If a retiree does not have the financial means to assume a larger portion of the Freedom Blue plan the Manna Fund is available to financially assist the retiree.

### + Manna Fund

The Manna Fund was established to assist our retired clergy and surviving spouses with financial needs. The income limits to qualify for a Manna Fund distribution were recently changed to 200% of the federal poverty level as defined by the US Department of Health and Human Services; the 2022 Manna Fund income limits are \$25,720 for a single and \$34,840 for a couple. If you are aware of any of our retired clergy or surviving spouses that could benefit from a Manna Fund distribution, please encourage them to complete an application for assistance. Manna Fund applications are mailed to retired clergy and surviving spouses in April and an application can also be received from the Benefits Administrator at EC Church Center.

### + Transfer of 403(b) Pension Plan

The EC Benefits Trustees have approved a transfer of the 403(b) Pension Plan from Empower Retirement to Nationwide. The transfer of the plan assets will most likely occur in March 2023. Nationwide will have lower plan fees than with our current plan with Empower Retirement and their technology, i.e. website features for participants and plan sponsors, is also much better than Empower Retirement. Investment options will be different, but a very similar type and mix of investments will be available.

Our relationship with Jennifer Buehler and her team will continue in the same capacity with Nationwide as it is with Empower Retirement. Jennifer will continue to be a financial planning and retirement resource for EC pastors, as well as a contact for Nationwide.

There are many decisions and behind-the-scenes tasks to complete before the assets are transferred, and participants will receive multiple communications over the next four months from Nationwide and the EC Benefits Trustees, i.e. Kevin Henry and David King. Please help yourself by staying current with the released communications.

### + A Couple of End-of-the-Year Reminders:

Pastor Compensation Forms should be returned to David King, Benefits Administrator by January 16, 2023.

**Annual Statistical Report** is due to the EC Church Center 100 W Park Ave, Myerstown, PA 17067 by January 25, 2023.

**W-2 forms** for employees (incl. pastors) and **1099-NEC forms** for independent contractors are due by January 31, 2023, to the recipient and to the respective government agency. The 1099-NEC is a new form, replaces the 1099-MISC in most instances for churches, payments made during 2022, to be filled by January 31, 2023.

Pastors are employees of the local church and should receive a W-2 with federal, state and local taxes withheld from every paycheck.

The rates for the **active pastor health insurance** plan will not increase on January 1, 2023 (premium due Dec. 15, 2022). The health insurance rates are:



### How Well Do You Know Your Community? (Part 3) continued from November edition



The last few months we have been looking at how well we know our communities. As you may recall, last month we started to discuss the concept of prayer walking. We discovered that prayer walking can help us meet the people who live in our communities. It is important to take the opportunity to get to know them, ask about their needs, and begin to look for ways to show Christ's love to them. If we are going to make a difference where God has placed us, we must seek to know the people who make up those communities and understand what their perceived needs are.

I am asked often about my vision for the future of the Kingdom Extension Community. I have had the opportunity to share a full picture of the vision God has given me for KEC with some of our districts. Much of that picture is built on the idea of multiplication. God is calling our churches to a mindset shift from "addition" to "multiplication." While addition is not bad, (adding converts, members and churches is one way to keep our churches and ministries moving forward) it is not until we adopt a multiplication mindset that we can become the movement of God that we believe he is calling us to. This starts with multiplying our impact on the communities around us.

# When we truly start to understand our neighborhoods and communities, we can start to see the opportunities God has for us.

Through prayer walking and talking to our neighbors and local business owners we can learn things like food insecurity issues in our communities, poverty issues, lack of childcare options, shortage of programs for seniors, and many other things that burden the heart of the community. This is where we begin to think through our strategy to step in as the hands and feet of Jesus to show his love to people who need him.

Another way we can begin to learn about our community is by gleaning information about the area surrounding our churches. KEC is working to provide demographic information about your community through an organization called Mission Insite. Mission Insite can provide you with dozens of pages worth of valuable information about the social, economic, racial, and religious makeup of the area surrounding your church. ## Pastoral Assessment Center (PAC) News

The Ministerial Development Community will be running the Pastoral Assessment Center (PAC) this coming January.

Typically, a call to pastoral ministry is first sensed in an individual's heart and then shared with his pastor or elder. The pastor then connects the applicant with the Ministerial Development Associate and the process begins. Along with a variety of assessments, interviews, books and articles, and discipleship-focused Zoom calls known as 'Pre-PAC huddles,' this multi-day event in January is a communal process of listening alongside the applicants to hear and affirm their call to pastoral ministry. All applicants looking for candidate status or local/license pastor credentials are required to participate in the PAC.

### **PAC Prayer List:**

- Ask the Lord to give clarity to the members of the Pastoral Assessment Center as they seek the Lord's will for each of the applicants for pastoral ministry.
- Ask the Lord to provide wisdom, strength, guidance, courage, peace, and freedom of fear for the applicants and their wives.
- Ask the Lord for safe travels and smooth PAC logistics.

### **Coaching Information:**

Galatians 6:2, "Share each other's burdens, and in this way obey the law of Christ."

Pastoral candidates entering the denomination are required to enter a coaching relationship until they reach a permanent credential. But did you know the MDC offers coaching relationships for elders and deacons? Ministry can be difficult and often isolating. Having a partner in ministry to walk with you for a season is where coaching can support you and bless you. ### Institute for Church Leadership Rev. Dr. Joel Kime

The Institute for Church Leadership has a wonderful opportunity for your churches. This spring we are offering two classes that could significantly help the people in your church family engage with God's word. You heard that right: ICL classes are for everyone! We are wondering if you can please encourage your people to consider taking the classes. Perhaps your church would even subsidize the cost of the classes for those who complete them? Take a look at the summary of our spring 2023 courses, and I think you'll see how meaningful they will be to your people.

### Institute for Church Leadership Spring 2023 classes:

### Hermeneutics, Tuesdays, February 7 – March 21, 6:30-9:15 p.m.

Course Description: This course is an introduction to the interpretation of the Biblical text. The course will cover some of the basic skills of biblical interpretation, as well as exploring issues surrounding questions concerning what the Bible is and how it "works." The course will help equip the student to interpret, teach, and preach the Biblical text in a pastoral setting with an emphasis on moving from interpretation to appropriate application. Instructor: Tim Seiger

### <u>OT Survey, Tuesdays, May 2 – June 13, 6:30-9:15 p.m.</u>

Course Description: In this course the student surveys Old Testament literature, history, geography, culture, theology, and structure to understand and communicate what the Old Testament reveals about God. Additional issues addressed include: Who are the important people and nations? What are the significant events, and where do they happen? How is the Old Testament put together? How does the Old Testament apply to us today? What resources are available to understand, teach, and preach the Old Testament? Instructor: Tim Valentino

We also want to let our EC family know that we have updated the ICL curriculum. Each term, starting Fall 2023, we will offer one formative course and one informative course. Formative courses are designed to help students grow in their discipleship to Jesus and in their ministry practice. Informative courses are designed to help students learn about the Bible, theology and history, which of course will help form them as disciples of Jesus. Take a look at our new course schedule.
