



From the desk of Bishop Bruce Hill

At the close of a meeting recently, the committee chairman told us to enjoy the best season of the year. Another person in the meeting asked if that was in reference to it being fall or hunting season. The answer was, "YES!"

While many of us do like the cooler days and nights, the amazing fall colors and hunting season, others, like Gloria, will miss the 80-degree days. Whatever your feelings about the change from summer to fall, the changing seasons always remind me of the faithfulness of God.

When, following the flood, God released Noah and his family from the ark, he promised, "As long as the earth remains, there will be planting and harvesting, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night." (Genesis 8:22)
Every change in seasons reminds us that our God is faithful and keeps his promises.

Think about just a few examples from the Bible:

The Lord God called Abraham and promised to make him the father of a great nation. As we read the account of Abraham's life, we see lots of ups and downs, but we also see that everything that God promised did come true.

The Lord sent Moses to lead the people out of Egypt and to the Promised Land. It took nine plagues, a miracle at the Red Sea, and 40 years of wandering in the desert because of the people's sin, but God got them to the Promised Land. Years after the promise was made, Joshua led the people into their homeland. As Joshua approached the time of his death, he reminded the people of God's faithfulness. "Soon I will die, going the way of everything on earth. Deep in your hearts you know that every promise of the Lord your God has come true. Not a single one has failed!" (Joshua 23:14)

David was anointed as the next king while King Saul was still alive. But if you know the accounts of his life, it took years until David actually became king of Israel.

Jeremiah was a prophet of God - called the weeping prophet as his own people ignored him. Even Jeremiah, at times, wondered where God was, what was God up to, did he care as Jerusalem, the holy city, was destroyed? But no sooner had Jeremiah spoken his words of despair that he says in Lamentations 3:21, "Yet I still dare to hope." Jeremiah had hope because, "The faithful love of the Lord never ends! His mercies never cease. Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin afresh each morning." (Lamentations 3:22-23)

The secret of his hope is that Jeremiah believed God would not fail. So, Jeremiah expectantly looked to the Lord. Our God is faithful; he keeps his promises. The changing seasons reminds me that every promise God has made will be kept. I pray that we will be faithful followers of him. As the writer of Hebrews expressed it, "Let us hold tightly without wavering to the hope we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep his promise." (Hebrews 10:23)

Health Insurance Plan

The active pastor's health insurance plan will be moving to a Highmark Blue Shield plan through Guidestone Financial [Guidestone]. Guidestone is the benefits organization for the Southern Baptist Convention of Churches. Our current insurer, Missio Benefits, suffered significant financial losses related to the COVID-19 pandemic and is ceasing operations on November 1, 2021. We are thankful to Guidestone Financial for providing a health insurance plan with benefits very similar to our current plan. There will be a modest rate increase to churches effective on January 1, 2022. Bennecon will remain the provider of the HRA at the same benefit levels. Information will be released to health plan participants as the transition to Guidestone progresses. The dental, vision and Life and AD&D plans are not moving to Guidestone. The participants on those plans will be contacted individually to discuss the new plans.

*If you are an EC Pastor below Medicare Eligibility age and not on the EC group health insurance plan, you **must** complete a Health Insurance Election Not to Enroll form that is available on the website, <http://www.eccenter.com/Left/Member-Login/Benefits-Information/Health-Insurance.aspx>. **The form must be completed each year by December 15.** Please return the completed form to Dave King. The form may be mailed to EC Center, faxed to 717-866-7583, or returned electronically to Dave King at dking@eccenter.com. *If you are returning the form electronically, please do not include your social security number.*

Highmark Freedom Blue

The rates for the Highmark Freedom Blue plan are increasing by \$6/mon to \$255/mon per person with minor changes in benefits. The change will be affective on January 1, 2022 to be paid by December 15, 2021.

It is very important that the retiree does not fall behind on payments to Highmark Freedom Blue. If a retiree is having difficulty paying the monthly premium the Manna Fund is available for financial assistance. Cost of Living Allowance

Some may have heard that the Social Security COLA increase this year will be the highest since 1982. The current internet chatter is estimating the increase at around 6%.

The official release of the Social Security COLA is normally in October, but also seems to be released later and later every year. The Pastoral Compensation Committee annual report approved at the May 2021 National Conference continued the recommendation of awarding pastor salary increases at the Social Security COLA increase. As information becomes available, we will pass it along.

The 2022 Pastoral Compensation Forms will be available on the Church Center website shortly, in a couple of weeks or so. Expect the Social Security Administration to release the 2022 COLA in late October 2021, if we are lucky. Please be respectful and honoring of the job your pastor is doing and offer as much of an annual salary increase as is possible. In addition, the National Conference adopted the statement that,

“Churches that are financially able are encouraged to give either a larger percentage increase or to consider an additional increase as a merit raise in salary for each pastor.

This merit raise would be in addition to the approved percentage salary increase.”

The changes in Sunday morning worship services, ministry programs and church operations caused by the pandemic have been hard on pastors. They deserve to be rewarded for the job they are doing.

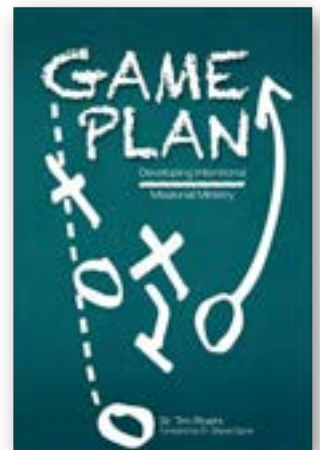

Things You Can Do RIGHT NOW To Build Your Digital Ministry

As we come out of COVID-19 (we hope), many of us are trying to find a place for all of the new knowledge and strategies we have gained in the trenches of the last 18 months. You may be tempted to leave it in the past and wash your hands of it. I would encourage you not to do this. Even if we are never again struck by a global pandemic, digital spaces will continue to grow in importance and prominence. People will find your church and make decisions about your church online. You may never get a chance to make your pitch to them in person, so your digital presence is CRUCIAL. That's why I want to share with you one BIG TIP that has helped me tremendously as I try to grow in this space.

Ready? Here it is: **Engage With Churches Doing Digital Ministry Well**

This may seem obvious, but we sometimes miss the obvious things. You don't have to be innovative and make new things to have an excellent presence online. So let's take a look at three churches and see what they are doing.

1. Saddleback Church

Every time you create something online, imagine your audience and create for them. What links do they need and what do they need to know to move forward?

2. Northpoint Community Church

Northpoint is one of my favorite online churches. I want to pull out two things they do.

1. They reply to EVERY Facebook comment. This is simply the right thing to do. People are putting themselves out there when they comment on your stuff. Let them know they are seen and heard by replying. Also, this engagement causes Facebook to show your church's content to more people.
2. Their website is nearly perfect. As you scroll down, look at how many times they tell you "Join Us on Sunday." Everything is centered around that call to action. If your website isn't pushing people through an obvious path that leads them to do something you want them to do, it is a nice brochure. That's fine. Brochures are great. But what if it could be both? Something as simple as creating a "Plan a Visit" page on your website can help people feel like they are talking a next step on your website.

3. First Capital Christian Church

First Capital is a smaller church in Indiana and their digital pastor, Tyler Sansom, is excellent. Check out their Facebook page. They don't have a lot of graphics. They focus on engagement and connecting with people. In fact, they take this a step further by intentionally creating online influencers in spaces of interest to them. Tyler, for example, has a YouTube channel where he posts covers of popular songs and the short films he creates.

Occasionally, he mixes in a testimony or a devotional. In doing this, he is ministering to an online community by actively engaging in that community.

I hope these quick looks have been helpful and I hope you will take the time to follow some of your favorite churches online. There is no need to blaze a new trail.
