EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR NEWS KEVIN HENRY



Thank you to all that have timely paid the worker's compensation invoices.

Payments for the Disability and Benefit Corp Services fee were due January 15 and April 15 respectively; both fees are listed on the 2022 Treasurer's Guide available on members.eccenter.com.

+ The active pastor's health insurance plan with Guidestone will see a minimal or no cost increase for 2023. We can only speculate why the increase is what it is when consumer prices have risen dramatically over the last year or so. Nevertheless, we will be thankful and grateful, but will remain cognizant that this year is not typical. Higher increases will be coming.

As reported in the September EC Leader, the Highmark Freedom Blue Medicare supplemental plan rates are NOT increasing for 2023. The premium will remain at \$255/person per month pending EC Benefits Trustee approval. The EC Benefits Trustees will be meeting on Tuesday, Oct 4, to approve the 2023 health insurance plan renewals. The health insurance renewal decisions of the trustees will be released shortly after the meeting.

The open enrollment period for the active pastor's health insurance plan with Guidestone begins on Nov 1. If you would like to, or need to, join the Guidestone health insurance plan please contact Kevin Henry or David King prior to Dec 1 for enrollment information. The plan is open to stationed pastors working at least 30 hours per week and under Medicare eligibility age.

+ The process to select a new 403(b) plan provider or confirm the decision to stay with Empower Retirement is underway. Four providers - one of the four is Empower Retirement - have been selected as potential partners and the trustees have, or soon will be, meeting with each of the four firms via Zoom.

We started with a list of ten possible providers along with a list of required services we expected from each potential provider. From that list of ten providers, four remained. The four remaining firms are evenly matched, although each has individual strengths and weaknesses. It will be a difficult decision to choose a new provider. We hope to make a decision at the next trustee meeting on Oct 4, but we are not going to force a decision just to make a decision. When and if a decision is made to move our pension plan provider away from Prudential/Empower Retirement there will be many communications over a multiple month process. It will be a major undertaking to move the pension plan assets. Thanks to Jennifer Buehler and her team for doing the bulk of work on this project. Her expertise and experience were invaluable, and this could not have been done without her and her team. Please pray for the EC Benefits Trustees and their meeting on October 4.

+ The pastoral compensation committee recommends using the Social Security COLA for the 2023 annual pastor salary increase. If the internet prognosticators are correct, the 2023 Social Security COLA will be higher than the 5.9% COLA for 2022. We are all experiencing the same increases in consumer prices and lay leaders may have received wage and salary increases from their employer to offset the increase in consumer prices. Please prayerfully consider an annual salary increase for your pastor in 2023.

The 2023 Pastoral Compensation Forms will be available on the Church Center website shortly, in a few weeks or so. Expect the Social Security Administration to release the 2023 COLA in late October 2022, if we are lucky.

How well do you know your community?

I'll never forget sitting in a meeting with our Outreach Committee years ago. We were discussing the importance of reaching our community with the Gospel and helping people know they were loved by Jesus. We decided it would be a great idea to hold an event that would show the community generosity and love. After brainstorming, some ideas were suggested and excitement began to grow. However, it didn't take long before the question was asked, "Is this idea something that would meet the needs of actual people in our community?" That question was followed up with, "What do the people of our community ACTUALLY need?"

To be honest, we couldn't answer that. We had many thoughts about what they might need. Most of those ideas were skewed by our traditions and our world views. I'm not talking about their need for Jesus, that was and is foundational to outreach. What I'm talking about is the felt needs and perceived needs of the people in your community that surround your church or your home.

In Mark 10 we read of a blind man named Bartimaeus who learns Jesus is walking by. He starts crying out, "Jesus, Son of David," hoping to get him to stop. Bartimaeus was obviously in need. He is begging on the roadside. He clearly needs food. Does he need money? A place to stay? Maybe some clothing? Sight? Of all people, Jesus should already know! He should (and does) have perfect understanding of Bart's needs. But instead of simply solving his problems, Jesus takes the time to engage Bartimaeus. He actually asks Bartimaeus what he wants him to do! THIS IS HUGE!!!! Jesus asked the hurting man what he longed for!



"Why don't we do this? Why don't we take the time to get to know our community? The families around us? The real and perceived needs of the community? If we could step into these needs, imagine what a difference the church could make. Imagine the impact it would have on the people of our community if we simply asked the question, "what is it you need?" They would feel valued, loved and seen. They would know your church actually cares for them."

Next month we will talk about a great way to get to know your community. It is called prayer walking.

But for now, could we as pastors and lay leaders just simply start asking the people we run into in the grocery store and at the gas station, at schools and in the park, "what is it that you need or that you think this community needs?"

Just listen, learn, and pray!




