

New Phone System at EC Church Center!

EC Center recently switched to a VOIP phone system. Along with a monthly cost savings the new system will increase our communication capabilities. The most notable change is that calls made to the main phone number will be answered by the auto attendant. The caller will then dial an extension, select the dial by name feature, or wait for the receptionist to answer their call. Callers are encouraged to have the extension of the person or department, listed below, available to efficiently move through the auto attendant to have your call answered as quickly as possible. An auto attendant service on a phone system can cause caller frustration. I have experienced that a few times as well. However, the number of misdialed, telemarketing and spam phone calls answered by the Church Center staff has decreased dramatically since the installation of the new telephone system. Not having to stop work to answer an unnecessary phone call has benefited the office workflow. Ministry funds, paid by EC churches, funds Church Center operations, and a more efficient office helps all of us. The new phone system has other features that we are still learning, so please be patient with us if we accidentally disconnect a phone call.

Thank-you to all that have timely paid the worker's compensation invoices.

Payments for the Disability and Benefit Corp Services fee were due January 15 and April 15 respectively; both fees are listed on the 2022 Treasurer's Guide available on members.eccenter.com.

- + If you have been following the news, the 2023 Social Security COLA increase is projected to be higher than the 2022 increase. The current internet chatter is estimating the increase at 9% or above. The official release of the Social Security COLA is normally in October, but also seems to be released later and later every year. The Pastoral Compensation Committee annual report approved at the May 2022 National Conference the continued recommendation of awarding pastor salary increases at the Social Security COLA increase.
- + Most likely, there will also be a moderate increase in health insurance premiums effective January 2023. Calendar year 2023 appears to be shaping up to bring some financial challenges to churches. As information becomes available, we will pass it along.
- + The Highmark Freedom Blue 2023 renewal will most likely be approved by the EC Benefits Trustees at the October meeting, with a rate increase of \$0/month. Premiums for the Highmark Freedom Blue plan are not increasing for 2023. The monthly premium will remain at \$255 per month. Participation in the Highmark Freedom Blue plan is voluntary for retirees. Retirees are encouraged to investigate other MC Supplemental plans and choose a plan best for their healthcare needs and cost.
- + There are several churches that have not remitted the \$100/yr disability insurance premium and the \$125/yr benefit services fee. If the disability premium is not received for the year the pastor is not covered. The disability premium is listed in the Treasurer's Guide on the EC website, and is due by January 15 of every year. The \$125/yr benefit services fee is due April 15 every year, and is due from every church with an assigned pastor.



What Moves You?

Do you remember the last time you were moved to tears? When something happened that caused your eyes to well up or maybe even caused you to break down in tears? Maybe it was a moment of sadness or brokenness, perhaps feeling overwhelmed by the sheer magnitude of the mountain you face. Or, it may have been something inexpressibly good! You were filled with such joy or an overwhelming sense of the love of the Father that you simply welled up with tears. These are the things that move us.

In the last six months I have found myself repeatedly being directed to Matthew chapter nine where we see what moved Jesus. In context, Jesus is traveling around doing what Jesus did; teaching, evangelizing, and healing. Matthew gives us a glimpse into the heart of Jesus and what moved him in verse 36 when he tells us, "When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." (ESV) The King James Version says he was moved with compassion. When Jesus saw people, he was not overwhelmed with judgement, or anger, or frustration, or disappointment; he was moved with compassion. He recognized the political and religious systems that had confused and misguided the masses. He recognized that they were helpless, and they needed a shepherd, a GOOD shepherd! He was moved to action. He was moved to step into the messes and make a difference.

When I look at the decline of the Evangelical Church in America and specifically the continued decline of the Evangelical Congregational Church, I can't help but wonder if part of our problem is that we are no longer moved with compassion for our communities. We are easily moved with anger at the political and moral shifts we see taking place. We are easily moved with frustration at the lack of involvement in church and the other activities that take place on Sunday mornings in our communities.

We are easily moved with confusion as to why "things are the way they are." We are easily moved with judgement over the standards and behaviors that define the lives of our neighbors. But when was the last time you watched the news, saw your neighbors, interacted with your community and were moved with compassion? When was the last time you saw people who are harassed and helpless because they have nowhere to turn and so they are just trying to figure it out on their own and you were moved with compassion?

What set Jesus apart is that he was willing to step into their brokenness without judgment and meet people where they were. He saw their hurt and their needs and stepped in to meet them. He was moved with compassion. He asked his disciples to be moved in the same way and allow that compassion to drive them to prayer! Pray that God would raise up harvest workers; those who would go out and engage with the harvest field to bring the hope that he was bringing.



My hope for the EC Church is that we would again be moved with compassion. That we would look at the neighborhoods and communities around our churches and homes and we would see people; hurting people who are harassed and helpless who need shepherds to step in and guide them through relationship. A good shepherd doesn't beat his sheep, he gently leads his sheep. He guides them with love, to where they need to be. For the



remainder of this year, would you join me in praying that God would stir us and our congregations to be moved with compassion? A compassion that moves us to action
