From the Bishop

Most of us can't wait to change the calendar from one year to the next. Goodbye 2020. Welcome 2021! And yet what have we learned? What have we discovered as we've navigated the challenging year of 2020?

I am reminded of the Old Testament prophet Habakkuk. Habakkuk was upset, frustrated, and he wanted to know just what in the world the Lord was doing. He cried out, "How long, O Lord, must I call for help? But you do not listen! 'Violence is everywhere!' I cry, but you do not come to save. Must I forever see these evil deeds? Why must I watch all this misery?" [Habakkuk I:2-3a] Habakkuk was impatient and frustrated. Sound familiar? His question to God is; if God really cares, if God is holy, how can he allow all this to happen; where he is when the people need him?

God then answers him saying he knows how much of a mess there is and it is his perfect plan to discipline Israel; a neighboring nation will




invade and destroy them. But Habakkuk has a problem with that. First, he can't believe that God would destroy his own people. Secondly, he can't believe a holy God would use a sinful nation to execute judgment. God's response is that Habakkuk must be patient and trust a perfect, holy God.

I admit there are times when I find it challenging to understand the work of a holy God. And yet, the season of Christmas we've just celebrated reminds me to trust in God even when my faith is challenged. Israel was looking for the Messiah, but they were not looking for a poor little baby born in a stable and laid in a manger. They weren't prepared for a carpenter to become a teacher / preacher / miracle worker. They couldn't understand a Savior who had to die. Their definition of God's will and actions didn't allow God to do what God said he would do. But that was God's perfect will. That reminds me to be careful not to define God in such a way that I miss out on what God is doing in my life and in the world even when I can't clearly see it.

Habakkuk eventually saw the work of a holy God. The Babylonians did invade Israel in 597 B.C. as the Lord prepared his people for the coming of the Messiah. Almost 600 years later, when Jesus was born, a few people were still waiting and were open to the work of a holy God; shepherds, and an old man named Simeon, and a prophetess named Anna. They all saw, recognized, and worshipped the Christ child.

The advent of Jesus, the movement from one year to the next, reminds us that God has a perfect plan, that he knows what he's doing, that he is holy. May that give each of us confidence in what God is doing in our lives even, or especially, when it's hard to see.

News from the Executive Director

The 2021 IRS mileage reimbursement rate has not been released at the writing of this article.

Active pastor health insurance premiums will remain the same, no increase, from the 2020 rates.

The first payment of the new year is due **December 15, 2020**. Please see **www.eccenter. com** for the current rates.

The deadline to submit HRA reimbursements for the October 2019 – September 2020 plan year is **December 29, 2020**. This is a federally mandated deadline that cannot be changed.

Church contributions to the 403(b) pension plan will increase on **January 1** to \$320 for full time pastors and \$160 for part time pastors.

The EC Benefits Corp. services fee is \$125 payable on April 15, 2021.

W-2s and 1099-NEC (Non-Employee Compensation) forms are due to the recipients by February 1, 2021 and the respective Federal, State or Local taxing authorities by February 1, 2021. Please refer to the specific taxing authority regulations for due dates. All full time and part time Pastors should receive a W-2 from their church. The 1099-NEC is a new form replacing the 1099-MISC in most instances for churches payments made during 2020.

Due Dates: Disability Payment \$100.00 due **Jan. 15**

Annual Statistical Reports due Jan. 25

Workers Compensation Insurance Information due 30 days after receipt

Pastors Compensation Forms due Jan. 15

Please see the **2021 Treasurer's Guide** located on www.eccenter.com, for additional due dates, current amounts due and ministry fund percentage.

Remember to add the following phrase (or something close to it) to all tax deductible giving receipts issued by a church or ministry, "No goods or services were exchanged for these contributions or they consisted of an intangible religious benefit." All year end contributions to a church must be received at the church on **December 31** or have a postmark of **December 31** or earlier. Electronic giving adds a layer of complexity to the yearend giving deadlines. There are extra entities involved e.g., credit card processors, banks, and internet gateways, that are involved in the processing of an electronic charitable contribution that churches and donors cannot control. The amount of time from the donor making a contribution until the church receives the funds can be a couple of days to a week or more. Church treasurers should carefully review the processing statements received to note what day a contribution was processed.

IRS Guidance that has been released states that contributions made by credit card in 2020 are considered 2020 contributions, regardless if the donor does not make a payment on the credit card until 2021 or with normal credit card processing times the church does not receive the funds until 2021. The same is true for donations made via an ACH transfer. A donor that initiates an ACH transaction in 2020 with the funds debited from the donor's bank account should be counted as a 2020 donation. Even though, the church will not receive the funds until 2021 with normal bank processing times.

Church Center Renovations

Due to the pandemic, we haven't had many visitors to our EC Church Center building, and all are meetings have been virtual. So, this announcement may not have a direct impact on too many, but we're beginning some much-needed renovations to our main entrance. The old circular steps were so deteriorated that they needed to be repaired or replaced. After talking with a few contractors, we discovered that the repairs would cost almost as much as a full replacement. Therefore, we have made the decision to replace the steps and the main entrance to the building. Not only will it look nice and be much safer, but it will also return some of the original look of the building when it was constructed 100 years ago.

This work began with demolition on December 3. Due to weather concerns, and the extended lead times on construction supplies in this COVID era, the front entrance to EC Church Center will probably be closed for about 3 months. Following the work on the main entrance, we are planning on doing some remodeling on the second floor to make our operations more efficient.

As per our current policy, please make an appointment if you do need to come to our denominational headquarters in Myerstown. Follow the signs directing you to the side entrance off the parking lot and use the intercom for building access.





A Young Girl Comes to Faith and Family Follows

A child in the Philippines places her faith in Jesus Christ after receiving an Operation Christmas Child shoebox and participating in The Greatest Journey.

When Athena was 8 years old, she received a gift-filled shoebox through Operation Christmas Child. Living in an impoverished area of the Philippines, the young girl had never received such a present.

Athena began to learn about how much God loves her when she read The Greatest Gift, a Gospel story booklet Samaritan's Purse developed for shoebox recipients. She was so excited to learn more about God that she then participated in The Greatest Journey, a 12-lesson discipleship course the organization developed for shoebox recipients.

- > **We give praise that**, while a number of our missionaries and international church leaders have contracted Covid 19, none have had serious symptoms or lasting side effects. Please continue to cover all of them in prayer, as for many, there are no decent medical facilities nearby to help them.
- Our VBS project for this year is to raise funds for Nepal (see front page of January Global Prayer Guide.) The land where the denominational headquarters is built also houses the orphanage property and a church. If the land next door is sold to a private owner or a business, they would have the right to object to the services and training done at the headquarters. Since Christianity is barely tolerated in this Hindu kingdom, things could be made very difficult for our churches there. Our goal is to raise \$10,000 towards the estimated purchase price of \$30,000. Please pray about this and see if your church, youth group or MMK group would like to help. More information will be forthcoming in spring.
- Congratulations to Jonathan & Kathy Wilson, who gained two new granddaughters just as they left for their village in mid-September. Son Justin and his wife welcomed Milly, and daughter Sarah and her husband welcomed Selah Dawn. We understand everyone is doing well. Unfortunately, Kathy & Jonathan won't be able to hold those precious little ones until they come back to the USA in 2022 for their year of furlough. Until then, there will be a lot of Zoom and online chats, I'm sure!

National Conference 2021

One of the questions the bishop has heard a lot recently is – "Are we going to be able to have a National Conference in 2021?" His answer has always been "Yes! We will have National Conference one way or another."

As you know, our 2020 Conference was cancelled due to the significant restrictions caused by the pandemic; travel was curtailed, group sizes were limited, and eventually, Messiah College informed us they could not safely host us on their campus. Some of those realities have changed, some have not. Recently, Messiah informed us they were not yet able to offer us a contract for May 2021; but we both signed a non-binding letter of intent for 2021. We intend to hold National Conference on May 26,27,28, 2021 at what is now Messiah University and Messiah intends to host us. That is our desire and plan.

If the pandemic does not allow us to go to Messiah for National Conference, we are looking at holding a virtual National Conference in May. Obviously, this will require extra work and preparation, but we do need to hold National Conference. The National Ministry Team voted to extend Bishop Hill's term another year until July 1, 2022; but it would not be fair to him or to the candidates to draw the election out any further. The election of the next bishop should take place in May 2021. In addition, there are votes on credentials that need to be held, as well as votes on amendments to the Discipline.

This past year has caused us all to be flexible, think outside the box, and learn new technologies. Please pray for Bishop Hill, the Church Center staff, and the members of the National Ministry Team as they work together to plan National Conference 2021 either in-person or online. Our hope and prayer is that we will be able to meet face-to-face and enjoy the fellowship that is part of conferencing and is so vital to the life of our connectional denomination.
