Thanks to everyone who has returned the Worker's Compensation audit forms in a timely manner. The return rate this year is very good. It is important that we receive all the salary information to obtain an accurate worker's compensation billing. Missing information will be estimated and most likely estimated higher than actual, resulting in a higher bill. Please help yourself and other EC Churches by returning the Worker's Compensation audit forms.

The annual disability premium, \$100, was due January 15 and the Benefit Corporation administrative fee, \$125, is due by April 15, 2020, **retirees are not subject to the administrative fee**. Both of these fees are listed in the Treasurer's Guide available on the EC website. Many have remitted the disability fee in a timely manner and a few have submitted the administrative fee and we thank you for your diligence and hard work.

Treasurer's please begin using the 2020 Ministry Fund forms for January offerings. Offerings collected in December 2019 should be remitted on the 2019 Ministry Fund forms.

Pastoral Compensation Forms

To date only about 50% of pastoral compensation forms have been returned. We will be reminding non-compliant churches to complete and submit their pastoral compensation forms. Please save Dave King some work by submitting your pastoral compensation forms as soon as possible.

Pastors and churches are permitted to obtain health insurance outside of the denominational sponsored plan. If you have obtained health insurance outside of the denominational plan, please be aware of the possible tax consequences and be diligent in the compliance requirements.

National Conference Registration

Registration for the 2020 National Conference will be available early March 2020. We will follow the same electronic registration process as last year. Paper registration is available on request. There will be multiple educational experiences offered on Thursday afternoon, remember to register for one educational session in each of the three sessions. To be compliant with the safety and security policies of Messiah College all national conference attendees must register. An attendee is defined as anyone entering the campus of Messiah College with the purpose of attending the EC National Conference. An Episcopal election always attracts a big crowd. If you are eligible to vote in the Episcopal election but do not register, we will not know you are coming and we will not have a ballot prepared for you.

*Superannuated/retired pastors not serving a church do not pay the registration fee. Spouses of pastors, active or retired, do not pay the registration fee.

Additional billing policies will be released when the registration period opens.

To be a good steward of our environment Messiah College is requiring that the plastic meal cards be returned at the end of conference. If a certain number of the total meal cards supplied for national conference are not returned a fee will be assessed to the National Conference by Messiah College. The EC conference services team will collect the meal cards at the end of conference.

Ministerial Development Community

The Steps That Lead to Credentials in the EC Church

The Ministerial Development Community consists of several sincere, well-trained, and experienced leaders who have been equipped to guide individuals toward fruitful, vibrant ministry within their potential callings. Below is a simple checklist for an individual who may be sensing a ministry calling.

- Discuss your ministry calling with as many sincere people that you know. Since a ministry calling is always affirmed by the church, a good place to start is with your pastor(s) and other trusted leaders within your congregational setting.
- Do NOT develop a plan of action on your own. Before enrolling in any educational pursuit, please contact the Ministerial Development Associate (MDA) in order to discuss the overall picture of callings, credentials, discipleship, and education. A meeting between the MDA, your pastor, and you can help to simplify your considerations early within the process.
- When you have completed the steps above, you should enroll in the next available Pastoral Assessment Center (PAC)—the next one is scheduled for January 2021. This assessment process is designed to help you understand where God is currently using you and how best to proceed toward your next steps in ministry. Enrollment is open for this process beginning now until June 1 of this year, when online huddles are formed and begin to meet.
- Take your time. When God calls, he equips. With each calling, we receive passion, and our passions tend to drive us into a hurried approach to start doing the thing that we expect will bring us greater fulfillment with God—to do his work. However, this process requires patience and steadfastness that will pay dividends in the end if we submit to a slower timeframe.

Sensing a Calling? Please speak with your lead pastor and then contact our Ministerial Development Associate, Jeffrey Byerly (jgbyerly@eccenter.com) to arrange a time to discuss the process toward fulfilling that calling within the Evangelical Congregational Church.

A Special Note for Lead Pastors: If someone within your congregation is sensing a call to ministry, you are an instrumental part of their development in ministry. Begin now to meet with them, test their gifts, utilize their passions in ministry, and disciple them into healthy practices and a deep relationship with Jesus Christ. As your

applicant enters the process, we expect your assistance to continue within their personal development as we guide them toward ministry in the kingdom.
