From the Bishop

Last month I began what will be a series of articles on the subject of ministry funds, the money local churches give to the denomination. In order to resource, encourage and equip one another our National Conference asks every local congregation to contribute a percentage of their income to the National Conference in order to accomplish "together" ministries. There are basically four areas of expense for the National Conference: Commissions & Committees, Church Center operations and denominational leadership, affiliate support, and heritage care. This month I want to look at the work of our five commissions

The Church Health **Commission** serves the local church that is in decline and in need of renewal. Through this commission local congregations can access Natural Church Development consultations and surveys which serve as "health screenings" for churches; conflict mediation, which is used when congregational conflict cannot be resolved by the congregation's leadership; and yoked ministry when two or three congregations voke together and share a pastor or ministries. The commission

can also coordinate congregational mentoring where a healthy congregation provides encouragement, counsel, resources, and personnel to mentor congregations which desire to become healthy.

Our Church Planting Commission works with congregations who want to develop a philosophy and strategy of multiplication church planting. Multiplication church planting is defined as local churches planting local churches that plant local churches. Church plants multiply when local churches lead the way. The commission provides promotional and teaching resources and events that will help Evangelical Congregational churches and individuals identify their role in church planting as it encourages prayer support, planter assessment and training. planter coaching and care, and financial support.

The Evangelism and Discipleship Commission aids the local church by providing direction, training, and resources that enable local churches to make disciples of Jesus. There are currently committees providing encouragement and help in the area of Christian education and youth, discipleship and prayer mobilization, evangelism, men's ministries, and women's ministries. This commission also serves to resource leaders to recognize and respond to "cultural crises" with Christlike concern and action.

Rather than receiving ministry funds, the **Global Ministries Commis**sion depends on the donations of local churches and individuals who have a passion for fulfilling the Great Commission to the ends of the earth. The commission provides missionary recruitment and assessment; identifying those whom God is calling to this ministry, examining their giftedness, guiding them through adequate preparation, and enabling their appointment to areas of needed ministry. Once a missionary is on the field the commission coordinates missionary care which includes spiritual, emotional and financial support. Another significant area of commission oversight is our work with E.C. mission conferences around the world with

Church Health Commission—Healthy Pastors Team

The Healthy Pastor's Team promotes wellness to mind, body and spirit. It also serves to encourage and assist our pastors and churches to be

"healthy." This month we sought out Pastor Ralph Owens of Trinity EC in Royersford, PA who is in the "hot" seat a lot these days.

Ralph, what was your defining moment in changing your lifestyle?

Seven-eight years ago at my annual physical I complained of being exhausted all the time. The doctor firmly suggested exercise so I went home and spoke to my wife Connie and we decided on purchasing a Hybrid bike. I started slowly biking 3 times a week, 1/2 mile at 6-7 MPH and I was exhausted after each ride. I kept going and getting up to 8 miles at a time and going faster. It was getting easier and I was enjoying it. Next season, I was riding daily and longer rides of 20 miles on Saturdays at Green Lane Park. Then, toward the end of summer, I went to the bike shop as the Comfort bike was no longer comfortable. I purchased a road bike, and increased daily miles to 20-30 miles at the time the Launch Liberia initiative was announced. With the GMC's help, we formed two cycling teams and raised \$20,000 for the campaign. I arrived at conference with my son Nathan and others after riding 930 miles over 14

days. We took Sundays off visiting our EC



try but you seem to have an active one. I also do some running, cross training, free weights, bike ride from my house to the office (3 1/2 miles one way) and at times to visitations at homes. We have a shower at church, which helps, and everyone is grateful I can

shower before working.

Before that what was your attitude toward your "health"?

I was active off and on, but nothing like I am now. I was tired of being tired and knew a change was in order.

What other changes did you make?

A lot of fuel is needed to bike, I actually eat more, but also eat more fruit and veggies than in the past, and I have tried to cut back on the Coke and fries.

How difficult were the changes?

In the beginning it was tough, but the goal was achievable. I started out weighing 215, am down to 192 and on target to weigh 175 by Spring of 2015. My goal is to ride coast to coast in 2015. Steve Lockhoff, from St. Matthew's in Emmaus and my sons Nathan and Jeremy will join me on various legs of the trip.

What support did you receive? Does the congregation join

you? Throughout the summer, Tuesday is Family Ride Night for the church. We bike 12 miles round trip from Linfield

churches in Chicago, IL and Transfer, PA.

Pastoral ministry is not considered an "active" ministry but you usually attend. We also explored the D&L (Delaware and Lehigh Rail system) two Saturdays a month from June through September. They also pray for us and follow along our long rides on Strava or Facebook. My wife Connie rides on Tuesday night when she is able. My job description has also been modified to read, "A. Devote time to develop in spiritual mental, and physical health. B. Take allotted vacation and keep family time and ministry needs in healthy balance."


What was the impact on your spiritual life?

While the federal government has delayed the processing of individual tax returns the due dates for issuing W-2s and 1099s has not changed. Also, most state and local governments have not delayed their tax return processing deadlines. As such the deadline to distribute W-2s to employees, including pastors, is January 31 with the employer filing deadline of February 28 if filed on paper or March 31 if filed electronically. Social Security Administration's **Business Services Online** (BSO),

www.ssa.gov/bso, is an easy convenient method for producing the employee and employer copies of the W-2 on white paper, no forms, and for filing the W-2s electronically with SSA. We encourage all church treasurers that produce their W-2s in-house to use the SSA BSO services.

Reporting the cost of employer health insurance plans is not required on 2013 W-2s filed in 2014. This is a change from last year. It has been determined that the EC Church is a small employer, thus removing the requirement to report the cost of health insurance.

- Due Dates: Disability Payment \$100.00 due Jan. 15
- Annual Statistical Reports due Jan. 25
- Workers Compensation Insurance Informa-

tion due 30 days after receipt of the request for payroll information.

Please remember that the EC Benefits administrative fee is due from churches on April 15, 2014, retirees are not subject to the fee. The 2014 disability premiums are due January 15, 2014. Please remit them as soon as possible. The due dates for the administrative fee and disability premium are listed on the Treasurer's Guide available on the EC Church website,

www.eccenter.com

Please begin using the 2014 Ministry Fund forms for January offerings. Offerings collected in December 2013 should be remitted on the 2013 Ministry Fund forms.

The Annual Reports and fourth quarter Ministerial Update forms are both due by January 25, 2014 to Rev. Ken Wiest, Statistician, at the EC Church Center. OR can be emailed to

The 2013 Business Mileage Reimbursement decreased to \$.56/mile on January 1, 2014.

Year end giving statements to donors must include a phrase similar to or contain the words "no goods or services were exchanged for these contributions." The IRS has resources available, <u>www.irs.gov</u>, to assist with charitable contributions; Tax Guide for Churches and Religious Organizations and Publication 526 Charitable Contributions.
