From the Bishop:

Gloria and I started the new year with a trip to Israel. We joined with denominational leaders, all board members of the National Association of Evangelicals, on a trip sponsored by the Center for Holy Lands Studies and the Israel Department of Tourism. A lot of people wondered if we'd be safe (yes) and Gloria said it seemed like a lot of money to spend and a long way to go just to get blown up (we didn't). The Lord's presence was felt in many places and in many ways.

One of the locations we visited was the Church of the Primacy of Saint Peter, a Franciscan church on the northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee. The church contains a sec-

tion of the bedrock coming through the floor in front of the altar; it was supposed to be the spot where, after the resurrection, Jesus made a breakfast for the disciples and reinstated Peter (John 21). I'm not going to guarantee that it was the exact spot; but close enough for me that as Gloria and I sat together and then walked along the shore the question Jesus asked Peter kept coming to my mind and heart. Three times Jesus asked "Do you love me?"

We returned from Israel on a Saturday night and my week was filled with our Pastoral Assessment Center. As in past years we talked about the essential qualities for every pastor in the EC Church. 




Bishop's Top Ten Prayer & Praise List

Computers Donated to a Kenyan Orphanage



The deadline to distribute W-2s to employees, including pastors, is January 31, 2018 with the employer filing deadline also January 31, 2018 if filed electronically or on paper. Social Security Administration's Business Services Online (BSO), www.ssa.gov/bso, is an easy convenient method for producing the employee and employer copies of the W-2 on white paper, no forms, and for

Please remember that the EC Benefits administrative fee is due from churches on April 15, 2018, retirees are not subject to the fee. The 2017 disability premiums are due January 15, 2018. Please remit them as soon as possible. The due dates for the administrative fee and disability premium are listed in the Treasurer's Guide available on the EC Church website,

www.eccenter.com

Pastor's Compensation forms were due January 15, 2018. If you have not done so please return your compensation forms to Dave King as soon as possible. We will be contacting churches in early February that have not submitted 2018 compensation forms and requesting compliance.

Please begin using the 2018 Ministry Fund forms for January offerings. Offerings collected in December 2017 should be remitted on the 2017 Ministry Fund forms.

Year end giving statements to donors must include a phrase similar to or contain words "no goods or services were exchanged for these contributions or consisted entirely of a religious nature." The IRS has resources available, www.irs.gov, to assist with charitable contributions; Tax Guide for Churches and Religious Organizations and Publication 526 Charitable Contributions.
