JAPAN

he EC work in Japan was begun almost 40 years ago when Rev. John Masuda and his wife Machi returned to their homeland after finishing their higher education in the USA. John had become involved with the EC Church when, as a student at Houghton College, he was befriended by John and Ron Miller, fellow students and members of Seibert EC Church in Allentown, PA. Rev. John and Machi Masuda were commissioned as EC missionaries and returned to Japan with their young daughter Ruth to reach post war Japan for Christ.

The Masudas planted the mother church which is now Kyodo Grace Church. From there, several other churches were planted. Our current field leader, Rev. Nobuo Abe, pastors the Sagamihara Grace Chapel, and his son Tomoyuki and daughter-in-law Jessica are leading the church plant in Fuchinobe. Rev. Kenichiro Sudo is now pastoring at Kyodo Grace. Mr. Teiichi Arita founded a house church in Kobuchi. Currently Yoriyoshi Abe,



nephew of Nobuo, is finishing his M.Div. degree at Evangelical Seminary in Myerstown. He and his new bride Emiko will return to Japan after graduation next spring.

It is exciting to see the continuation of the EC Church in Japan through several generations. But Japan is still a very difficult country to evangelize, with only about 1% claiming to know Jesus as Savior. Our churches have been reaching out through various ministries: day care, English classes, training for young mothers, etc. to reach the needs of the Japanese people. Please continue to uphold our pastors and church members in prayer as they reach out in love to their family, friends and neighbors in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.
