## EC GLOBAL PRAYER GUIDE



he EC Church in Mexico was an outgrowth of the ministry started decades ago by Miss Mae Royer to orphaned children. Many of the orphans aided by Mae eventually went into the ministry, and started planting churches along the northern Mexican border. Today we have 12 active churches and several church plants in northern Mexico. Under the direction of recent field leader Rev. Elias Martinez, the churches began cooperating together more. At the same time, the leadership realized that not all the pastors had as much Bible and pastoral training as they should. Elias started a training program for the pastors; the conference still has periodic seminars and continuing

education for the pastors and wives.

With the turnaround in direction and purpose, it became evident that Mexico was well on its way to becoming its own national conference. GMC Director Rev. Randy Sizemore and Rev. Martinez worked together on the requirements and over the last several years, the churches have fulfilled them.

Earlier this year the EC Church of Mexico officially




applied to the National Ministry Team of the EC Church-USA to have National Conference status. That request was approved, and at the annual National Conference held in late May at Messiah College, the EC Church of Latin America was officially granted the status of a national conference. Mexico is the third international church to become a national conference; they join India and Japan. They asked that their name be listed at the EC Church of Latin America, since they have the vision to reach out to not only other states in Mexico, but also other countries in Central America.

Rev. Martinez finished his term as field director and passed the baton to Rev. Juan Zuniga, who became the first Superintendent of the EC Church of Latin America. His installation was celebrated in late July in Mexico, with an EC-USA delegation there as well. Rev. Zuniga's goals are: to expand missions to truly reach Latin America, group churches into districts to foster cooperation/synergy and emphasize the need for training through their Bible institute.
