d and Valerie Schubert are international missionaries serving in Honduras, Central America. In 2001, the Lord moved Ed and Valerie, and their two young sons, from their family dairy farm in northwestern Illinois to Honduras, beginning a journey that has lasted more than fifteen years.



Ed and Valerie serve as leaders of a ministry called Fundación Casa de Luz (House of Light Foundation). Casa de Luz serves 150 at-risk

children and their families by providing: spiritual life formation opportunities, quality child care, nutritious meals, supplemental education, medical assistance, food sponsorships, and character development programs. Community moms are also ministered to through the provision of family counseling, micro-business opportunities, Christian psychological services, Bible studies and mentorship programs. Two marginalized Honduran communities benefit from the involvement of Ed and Valerie and Casa de Luz as underfunded public schools and poor families receive concrete floors, new roofs, water & electrical projects and general construction assistance.

Ed and Valerie invite and direct volunteer ministry teams from churches throughout the United States. In addition, Ed and Valerie mentor fellow missionaries in crisis, coach and lead interns serving within Casa de Luz, and provide a "hosting ministry" to missionaries and Hondurans in need of mentoring, refreshment and encouragement.

Ed and Valerie have been joyously married for 28 years. They are blessed with two biological sons who both currently attend university in the U.S., a 10 year-old adopted daughter living with them in Honduras and six spiritual daughters. In all they do, the Schuberts live by this family mission statement... "Because Eternity Matters, we commit to live missionally and intentionally For Christ while serving others with joy and humility for the glory of The LORD!"


