Wake Up and Get to Work!

Month of the rest of the western world will celebrate Santa Claus coming to town. As I write this, Thanksgiving has not even arrived, but the stores are already touting Christmas decorations and gifts. This year it seems they barely waited for Halloween to pass before stocking Christmas themed merchandise. In fact, I think some stores had Jack O' Lanterns and Christmas trees side by side.

Many of us shake our heads and complain as consumerism continues to creep into our Holy days, but we feel helpless to do anything about it. We see our society going further away from Biblical standards and are discouraged, but also inactive. When did the Church become so ineffectual? Why is it that a movement that changed the world seems largely to be sitting on its hands today in America?

Recently I heard a sermon regarding this topic. It was based on Romans 13:8-14, where the apostle Paul addressed many of these same issues with the young church in Rome. He reminds them that their first responsibility is to love one another; this is the fulfillment of the law. Then he urges them to 'wake from your slumber' (v. 11) and realize that the Lord could come back at any time. In light of this, the believers have responsibilities.
