From the Bishop:

Welcome to the year 2020! What do you think of when you hear those numbers: 2020? One of the first things that comes to mind is vision. Did you ever wonder what 20/20 vision means? According to the American Academy of Ophthalmology, "A person with 20/20 vision can see what an average individual can see on an eye chart when they are standing 20 feet away. An eye chart measures visual acuity, which is the clarity or sharpness of vision. The top number refers to your distance in feet from the chart. The bottom number indicates the distance at which a person with normal eyesight can read the same line. For example, if you have 20/30 vision, it means your vision is worse than average. When you are standing 20 feet from the chart, you can read letters that most people see when they are 30 feet away." I really don't know what my vision is "by the numbers" but I can tell you that if I'm not wearing my contact lenses or glasses, I'd be bumping into walls!

When we think of visionary leaders in the Bible, David must be near the top of the list. He was a man chosen by God to lead God's people into a new era. It was David who received the vision of a grand house of worship, the Temple. But in 1 Samuel 27 we find David, anointed to be the next king of Israel, running for his life and saying "Someday Saul is going to get me." He doesn't sound like the same person who boldly challenged and defeated Goliath. Where is his vision now?

David had lost his vision because he had forgotten God's promises and stopped believing in God's power to protect him. Fortunately, in 1 Samuel 30, when David was at his lowest, he turned and "found strength in the Lord his God." He prayed a simple prayer, basically saying "Lord, what do you want me to do? Show me your will, revive my vision." And the Lord did that and more, he led David and gave him the victory.



Bishop Emeritus John E. Moyer, 87, passed away peacefully at his home in Myerstown on December 4, 2019. The son of the late Howard E. and Esther (Waltz) Moyer. He was born in the home of his parents in Allentown, on the first day of May, 1932. John is survived by his loving wife of 65 years, Dorothy A. (Berger) Moyer; sons John, David, and Timothy; eight grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

John graduated from Allentown High School in 1950 and Moravian College, Bethlehem, PA where he received a Baccalaureate of Arts degree in 1954. In the fall of that year, he attended the newly established Evangelical Congregational School of Theology in Myerstown, PA. Two years later, he was granted the degree of Bachelor in Sacred Theology from Temple University School of Theology in Philadelphia, PA.

Concurrent with his studies, John served his first appointments in pastoral ministry. He served one year at St. John's E.C. Church in Catasauqua. He also served for five years at Grace E.C. Church, Columbia, Lancaster County. Following his time in Lancaster, he was transferred to Trinity E.C. Church in Pottstown, PA. During this time, he began to assume denominational responsibilities such as conference director of Vacation Bible School and also as a staff member of one of the summer youth camps of the church near Stroudsburg, PA. In 1964, the church assigned John to St. Matthew's E.C. Church in Emmaus, PA. In this community, they found a ministry that was flourishing. During the next nine years, the church continued to grow.

In 1973, John was elected to serve as the Superintendent of the Western District of the Eastern Conference. John was also elected to assist in the Board of Publications as its Secretary and as a Trustee of

the Evangelical School of Theology. For five years, he was President of the Board of Trustees. In 1979, he was chosen to serve as Bishop, a position he held for two four-year terms. During these years, the denomination carefully assessed its structure, endeavoring to provide more effective guidance for the local congregations.

In 1980, Moravian College granted Bishop Moyer an Honorary Doctor of Divinity degree. When his second term in his office was completed in 1987, the Trustees of the Evangelical School of Theology invited him to take a position on the faculty of the school. He taught in the Practical Theology Department for the next 11 years. When he assumed this responsibility, he started working on a Doctor of Ministry de-



gree at Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, CA. The degree with a concentration in Church Growth was awarded to him in 1995. While serving on the faculty in Myerstown, he and three other members of the Historical Society, coauthored a book on the history of the Evangelical Congregational Church entitled, "Evangelical from the Beginning." In May of 1998, he retired from the career of pastoral ministry, administration and teaching.

At the time of his death he was an active member of New Life E.C. Church of Shillington, PA. The Evangelical Congregational Church, is thankful to the Lord for the life and ministry of Rev. Dr. Bishop John E. Moyer.

The first payment of the new year is due December 15, 2019. Please see www.eccenter.com for the current rates.

- The deadline to submit HRA reimbursements for the October 2018—September 2019 plan year is December 29, 2019. this is a federally mandated deadline that cannot be changed.
- Church contributions to the 403(b) pension plan will increase on January 1 to \$300 for full time pastors and \$150 for part time pastors.
- ₩ EC Benefits Corp services fee will increase to \$125 payable on April 15, 2020.
- W-2s and 1099-MISC forms are due to the recipient's by January 31, 2020 and the respective Federal, State or Local taxing authorities by January 31, 2020. Please refer to the specific taxing authority regulations for due dates. All full time and part time Pastors should receive a W-2 from their church.
- Due Dates: Disability Payment \$100.00 due Jan. 15

 Annual Statistical Reports due Jan. 15

 Workers Compensation Insurance Information due 30 days after receipt Pastors Compensation Forms Jan. 15

Please see the 2020 Treasurer's Guide located on www.eccenter.com, for additional due dates, current amounts due and ministry fund percentage.

Remember to add the following phrase (or something close to it) to all tax deductible giving receipts issued by a church or ministry, "No goods or services were exchanged for these contributions or they consisted of an intangible religious benefit." All year end contributions to a church must be received at the church on December 31 or have a postmark of December 31 or earlier. Electronic giving adds a layer of complexity to the year end giving deadlines. There are extra entities involved e.g., credit card processors, banks and internet gateways, that are involved in the processing of an electronic charitable contribution that churches and donors cannot control. The amount of time from the donor making a contribution until the church receives the funds can be a couple of days to a week or more. Church treasurers should carefully review the processing statements received to note what day a contribution was processed.

IRS Guidance that has been released states that contributions made by credit card in 2019 are considered 2019 contributions, regardless if the donor does not make a payment on the credit card until 2020 or with normal credit card processing times the church does not receive the funds until 2020. The same is true for donation made via an ACH transfer. A donor that initiates an ACH transaction in 2019 with the funds debited from the donor's bank account should be counted as a 2019 donation. Even though, the church will not receive the funds until 2020 with normal bank processing times.







January 1 is an important date for more reasons than it being the first day of a new year! January 1 is also the deadline for:

- Any pastor, elder, deacon or deaconess who decides to retire, transfer to the Superannuated or Supernumerary status effective the end of the National Conference year (June 30, 2020) must make his/her intention known by written notification to the Bishop office.
- ☼ January 1 is also the deadline for churches and pastors to submit written requests for a stationing change to the Stationing Committee in care of the Bishop.

These dates went into effect a couple of years ago but is important enough to call to your attention now. If you are making one of these decisions, and you haven't already contacted the Bishop's office, please do so immediately. 7th Annual Four Chaplains Scholarship Run

February 1, 2020 (Rain, snow or shine) 10:00 AM

We Honor Their Sacrifice 4 Mile Run/Walk 1.5 Mile Fun Run/Walk

In the early morning of February 3, 1943 the U.S.A.T. Dorchester was torpedoed by a German submarine and sank in the icy North Atlantic. Only 230 men out of the 902 on board the Dorchester survived. Of those that perished that night were four Chaplains: Methodist Pastor George L. Fox, Rabbi Alexander D. Goode, Reformed Pastor Clark V. Poling and Father John P. Washington. These chaplains gave up their life jackets and encouraged others as they made the ultimate sacrifice for other service men. Witnesses told stories of how the chaplains joined arms, said prayers and sang hymns as the Dorchester sank beneath them.

Each Chaplain was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart and Distinguished Service Cross on December 19, 1944. A one-time only posthumous Special Medal for Heroism was authorized by Congress and awarded by President Eisenhower on January 18, 1961. Congress attempted to confer the Medal of Honor but was blocked by stringent requirements that required heroism performed under fire. The special medal was intended to have the same weight and importance as the Medal of Honor.
