here are some months when I sit in front of my computer and struggle with what I should write about for the EC Leader. Actually, I should take the time now to at least start those articles so I don't forget them and maybe even get my stuff in to the editor on time! Maybe....

Anyway, I suppose you know that I have recently returned from a short term mission trip to Liberia, Africa where the EC Church has a number of churches. I traveled with Rev. Randy Sizemore (Director of Global Ministries), Rev. Josh Reinders (Pastor of Seneca EC Church) and Rev. Th. Janga (Field Superintendent of the EC Church in Nepal). I could write a lot about our trip; more than you'd probably be interested in reading. From our flight to Liberia, our travels around the country in the 106 degree heat, participating in their National Conference, visiting villages in the bush, and our trip home via the scenic route (Monrovia, Liberia to Conakry, Guinea to Paris, France to Minneapolis, Minnesota to Baltimore, Maryland) and finally home! But let me share five quick lessons learned from this visit with our brothers and sisters in Liberia.

1. They were very generous even in their poverty. A 14 year onagain, off-again civil war has destroyed the economy of this country. Most people live on less than one US dollar a day. Yet they sacrificially gave many free-will offerings to support the work of their National Conference. One pastor told me "We will not make our God a beggar. We will teach stewardship and our people will respond appropriately." And they do! Praise the Lord!

- 2. They were very gracious in their hospitality. In the villages families joyfully moved out of their hut so we could live there. They showed their appreciation for our visit with the best they could give us: one village gave us a live goat and another, a duck and a rooster. (And we put them in the back of our truck and took them along with us, but that's a story in itself!)
- 3. They are faithful in their journey. They are trusting God for great things in the church and its ministry of the Gospel in Liberia and beyond. Even though it will take a long time to see their plans come to pass, the way forward will be difficult, they are faithful to the vision the Lord has given them over the long haul. We may not see our dreams realized, but we can stay faithful to what God's called us to. His plans that are bigger than ours.



- 4. They take a healthy view of spiritual leadership, authority and accountability. There was great respect shown for both their own Liberian leadership and for us as representatives of the EC Church. Even when there were complicated discussions held we all could sense the Holy Spirit leading and a willingness to receive counsel.
- 5. For us, community is a theory, for them it is a practice and a way of life. They share life in far more ways than we do! Their understanding of life in community is more Biblical than ours. You can

actually experience what is described of the early church in Acts 2. I believe we have many things we can learn from them in this area.

So these are some lessons I learned. Please join me in continued prayer for our dear brothers and sisters in Liberia (and for our fellow ECers around the world). Many of them live in circumstances that are difficult for us to imagine; the amount of time and effort it takes to do "normal" things, like get water and prepare a meal is challenging. Yet they both love and serve the Lord, engaging their friends and neighbors with the Gospel of Jesus. I am thankful to be a partner with them and with you in that effort!


