News from the Executive Director

Conference Support Team Financial Relief for Churches

On April 11 an email was sent to all pastors, lay delegates and treasurers with three offers of financial assistance from the NC Finance Committee, Loan & Investment Committee and the EC Benefits Trustees. In summary, churches can defer payments on ministry funds for three months, defer all loan payments for three months or pay only loan interest for six months, and defer medical insurance payments for two months. Each of these offers for financial assistance are payment deferrals not payment forgiveness. Deferred payments will need to be paid by the end of the calendar year. Please see the April 11 email for details.

Churches are eligible for a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan. The PPP loans were created from the passage of the CARES act in late March. However, it has been reported that all the funds allocated to the PPP loans has been disbursed, I guess \$349B does not go as far as it used to. There is talk in Washington of allocating additional funds to the program but as of the writing of this report that has not occurred. Churches may contact their bank and submit a PPP loan application as soon as possible. Submit your PPP loan application now to be ready if/when the loan program is replenished. Please see the Small Business Administration website, SBA.gov for details on a PPP loan.

Please continue to send in your payments for the national conference, Global Ministries and EC Benefits. The Church Center staff is working limited hours and staggering their shifts during the Pennsylvania wide stay at home order, as such it may take a few extra days for us to process your payment(s). If you need to contact us, email is best. I appreciate and thank Pat, Jodi, Shirley, Abi, Pat S. and Dave for their hard work during these unusual circumstances.

Please take comfort in what has been said many times before, "none of this is surprising to God." Be well and be safe.

in May. On Thursday, April 16, the National Ministry Team made the decision to cancel National Conference 2020 and withhold all actions and elections until the National Conference scheduled for May 26-28, 2021.

- > The trip to India scheduled for last month by **Bishop Bruce Hill** and **Rev. Ted Rathman** was cancelled. India stopped issuing visas in early March in an attempt to stem the spread of the virus. At this time, we don't know if ECCI was able to hold elections for a new General Director in late April, but most likely they were not.
- > **Dan Moury's** trip to the Philippines in late April was also cancelled. However, if things are resolved regarding the virus in time, he is hoping to make the trip in late June.
- > **John & Carolyn Miller** have informed us that they have a new email address. Wycliffe is saving the 'sil.org' emails for those serving outside the USA. The Millers' new email, effective immediately, is Carolyn_Miller@wycliffe.org. Please change your records.
- > The Delaware Region Missions Brunch, like so many other events in late March, had to be cancelled due to concerns about the spread of the coronavirus. At this time there are no plans to reschedule it for this year. We are hoping that the Susquehanna Region Missions Brunch can be held in fall, and everyone who is interested and available will be invited to attend.

Hopefully by the time May begins, we will be through the worst of this pandemic. The GMC office has been keeping in contact with our missionaries throughout this difficult time. Those working at MK schools around the world have 'sheltered in place'; most schools closed and sent their students home as possible. Even in this chaos, our EC missionaries have been faithful to serve in whatever capacity they were allowed. Both Ron Anderson and BJ Whitaker in Spain shared from their homes with neighbors. Ron put a portable PA system in the windows in his attic and shared messages of hope with neighbors when they opened windows for the nightly salute to health care workers. BJ sang praise songs from his balcony. Ed & Val Schubert packed hundreds of food bags for the poorest of the families they serve at their day care/training facility in the capital city. As of this writing, as far as I know, all of our missionaries serving overseas have chosen to remain on their respective fields of service to continue to minister as opportunity allows. Please keep them in prayer; thank you.



EC Benefits

Thanks to everyone who has returned the Worker's Compensation audit forms in a timely manner. The return rate this year is very good. It is important that we receive all the salary information to obtain an accurate worker's compensation billing. Missing information will be estimated and most likely estimated higher than actual, resulting in a higher bill. Please help yourself and other EC Churches by returning the Worker's Compensation audit forms.

The annual disability premium, \$100, was due January 15 and the Benefit Corporation administrative fee, \$125, is due by April 15, 2020, **retirees are not subject to the administrative fee**. Both of these fees are listed in the Treasurer's Guide available on the EC website. Many have remitted the disability fee in a timely manner and a few have submitted the administrative fee and we thank you for your diligence and hard work.

Treasurer's please begin using the 2020 Ministry Fund forms for January offerings. fferings collected in December 2019 should be remitted on the 2019 Ministry Fund forms.

Pastoral Compensation Forms

To date only about 50% of pastoral compensation forms have been returned. We will be reminding non-compliant churches to complete and submit their pastoral compensation forms. Please save Dave King some work by submitting your pastoral compensation forms as soon as possible.

Pastors and churches are permitted to obtain health insurance outside of the denominational sponsored plan. If you have obtained health insurance outside of the denominational plan, please be aware of the possible tax consequences and be diligent in the compliance requirements.

This process continues to provide opportunities for healthy ministry to be cultivated within the EC Church.

As we finish out one conference year, we must prepare now to begin another. Therefore, we are starting now to receive registrations for the 2021 Pastoral Assessment Center.

If you are sensing a call to pastoral ministry, it is essential that you first discuss this matter with the lead pastor at your church and talk to other leaders who are able to observe your gifts and abilities in action. The deadline for registering for the 2021 Pastoral Assessment Center (PAC) is June 1, 2020. The date and location for the PAC are January 13-16, 2021 at the campus of Evangelical Seminary. There is no cost to those who are seeking credentials in the EC Church. Because pastoral ministry intermingles congregational life with one's family life, a pastor and his wife must understand how the unique dynamics of their positions are different than other typical vocations. For this reason, the wife of each applicant is required to attend. Please work out arrangements in adequate time for both of your attendance to participate.
