

Bishop addresses Tenth National Conference

Bishop Bruce Hill delivered his first Episcopal Address to the tenth annual session of the National Conference on Wednesday, May 23, 2012 at Messiah College, Grantham, PA. He focused on the Conference theme, "Passion."

Bruce cautioned that there may be "zombies" around us, those who think just following others is normal. He added that we may even see zombies in the mirror.

He continued that we are to be "fervent in spirit (Romans 12:11)" and asked, "When were you last excited about serving the Lord?" He encouraged that we can be excited about the special work God is doing in church planting and global ministries. He pointed out that both large and small churches are impacting their communities.

Bruce challenged the idea that today's church is post-denominational, explaining that

we are a denomination so that we may better fulfill the Great Commission. "Ideally," he commented, "we are a movement of God."

He described the Transformational Strategic Plan as a "big picture view. Everything will be put on the table for a task force to study and help determine what the denomination should fund." The committee will report in October and March.

He continued, "A movement will require change, but our foundation is God's Word, and we change as He leads. We will have to face fears of too much change and too little change."

"The fall of Jerusalem and the Babylonian exile brought an end to normal life, but prepared God's people for the Messiah."

Bruce concluded, "God is getting ready to do a new thing in the E.C. Church. A lot needs to be done but never lose sight of why we exist."

Churches celebrate anniversaries

Sunday, April 1 marked important anniversaries for two of our churches.

Wedgewood Park Church, Youngstown, OH celebrated 50 years at their present location and 80 years as a congregation.



The church had its beginnings during a series of nightly meetings in the early 1930's. A congregation came together, wanting to affiliate with a denomination, and chose to join the E.C. Church.

They met in a number of places before building on Breaden Street in Youngstown. The current building in Austintown was dedicated on Easter Sunday, 1962, while Rev. Robert Zetterberg was pastor. He and wife, Evelyn returned for the day.

A house next door was renovated for use as a parsonage and dedicated on October 12, 2003. A multi-purpose Family Life Center was dedicated on May 18, 2008. Both projects were completed during the pastorate of Rev. Michael Soltis.

The celebration included a message from Bishop Bruce Hill, a dinner, displays, and

a concert. Three members who were part of the church's earliest days, as well as former pastors and wives were present.

Conference Minister Gary Brown encouraged the church to "Strengthen the things that remain" - Bible study, giving, prayer, and worship.
