Ministerial Development Community— Serves people who sense the call of God on their life and respond by seeking a credential for ministry through the E.C. Church.

The church, the Evangelical Congregational Church really is all about people. Living life the way Jesus intended it to be; in dynamic relationships with people which helps them meet Jesus—his love and his life.

News from the Conference Network Team

The Conference Network Team (CNT) held its first official meeting as part of our new denominational structure. The purpose of the CNT is to provide counsel and encouragement to Evangelical Congregational leaders and to assure that our church's ministries are working together in unity to realize our denominational vision. It develops denominational initiatives, provides guidance in matters of accountability for EC credentialed personnel, and can make formal recommendations to denominational bodies. The membership of the CNT consists of the Bishop, the National Conference Secretary, Church Health Associate, Global Ministries Associate, Kingdom Extension Associate, Ministerial Development Associate, and the thirteen District Field Directors. The Executive Director is an advisory member.


The two major items on their agenda was to hold a number of elections as specified in the Rules of Conference and to plan a schedule of meetings.

The following individuals were elected to serve:

- Vice-Chairman of National Conference: Rev. Gary Brown
- Stationing Elders: Rev. Gary Kuehner (Delaware Region); Rev. Gary Brown (Great Lakes Region); Rev. Sterling Trimmer (Susquehanna Region)
- Advisory Members to the National Ministry Team: Rev. James Price (Delaware Region); Rev. Chuck Campbell (Great Lakes Region); Rev. Jeff Schell (Susquehanna Region)

We also agreed on a rather interesting four-level meeting schedule for various denominational leaders:

 The Bishop and Executive Director will hold a Daily Check-In, a five minute "stand-up"



meeting, to share daily schedules, priorities, and activities.

- 2. All the members of the CNT will participate in a **Bi-weekly (Fortnight) Tactical** meeting which will be limited to 45 minutes. Through the use of a "lightning round" agenda this conference call meeting will review daily activities, address immediate problems, update shortterm projects, identify tactical obstacles and issues, and other issues that require immediate attention.
- 3. A **Monthly Strategic** meeting will be held involving the Bishop, Executive Director, and Associates. This two-hour meeting will focus on critical concerns affecting fundamental issues and long-term ministry success.
- Lastly, all CNT members will participate in a day-long Quarterly Review as they come together for a review of strategy, direction, and team development, training, and resourcing.

Please be in prayer for the members of the Conference Network Team as they help guide our denomination in implementing our new structure and help us all to know Christ and make him known.

News from Benefits

The active pastor's health insurance renewal negotiations are a struggle this year. The renewal rates from Capital Blue Cross are double digit rate increase and there is a possibility that we may switch insurance carriers. However, with the healthy cushion in the HRA I anticipate rate increases to the churches to be under 10% and possibly under 5%. The EC Bene-

fits Trustees are meeting in early September and the new rates will be announced shortly after the meeting.

Thanks to all of you for dutifully returning the Highmark health assessment in a timely manner. We had a few stragglers and some omitted information on forms but overall the process was smooth. Thank you!

As we are currently in our open enrollment period, 60 days before the start of the new plan year of October I, you can make changes to your coverage, join the plan, add dependents, etc. outside of change of life events. Please contact Dave King if changes to your health insurance coverage are needed.

Please remember to submit all of your deductible and co-insurance claims to PrimePay on a timely basis. PrimePay will track all of your covered out of pocket healthcare expenses, including the first \$500 in covered medical expenses and the first \$1,800 in prescription co -pays and outpatient therapy visits (speech, physical, occupational and respiratory therapy) that are the responsibility of the pastor. Timely submission of claims helps EC Benefits monitor and assess the cost efficiency of the health insurance plan. Also, covered deductible and co-insurance claims must be incurred by September 30, 2016 and sub-

mitted to PrimePay for reimbursement ninety days from the end of the plan year which is December 29, 2016. Contact Dave King or Kevin Henry with any questions on submitting claims to PrimePay.

There are a number of churches that have not remitted the \$100/year disability insurance premium for each assigned pastor. If the disability premium is not received for the year the pastor is not covered. The disability premium is listed in the treasurer's guide on the EC website and is due by January 15 of every year.





The Kingdom Extension Community (KEC) is a team of ministry practitioners (we actually try to do this stuff; sometimes successfully) ready to walk with you on your ministry adventure. We don't do everything. We don't know everything. We don't even know all of the questions. But what we know and do, we are willing to share or pass along. Our purpose is defined by the following five statements.

- To communicate and encourage a kingdom mindset and strategy for extending the kingdom.
- 2. To assess local church potential for extending the kingdom within their contexts.
- 3. To deliver up-to-date resources and workshops that provide creative solutions for extending the kingdom.
- 4. To assist local churches in adopting concepts that will ultimately extend the kingdom within their contexts.
