INTRODUCTION

The original, *Pastor's Book of Occasional Services*, has proven to be a valuable resource to our pastors. Desiring to update this collection of services and liturgies, I tasked the Faith and Doctrine Committee to help me with this project. In order to best understand this collection of services, give careful attention to the introduction to the original project by Bishop John Moyer.

"The committee, in compiling this volume, does not propose to present a recommended or standard service of worship, which has to be followed by each of our congregations. Our denomination has always advocated a position of free worship. Each congregation prepares its own order of service to meet the needs of its worshipers. ... Diversity in worship is encouraged; however, healthy Evangelical Congregational churches must always worship as Christ instructs, in 'spirit and truth.' Such worship is characterized by openness to the guidance of the Holy Spirit."

This updated volume, *Pastor's Book of Services*, replaces the original volume, titled, *Pastor's Book of Occasional Services*. We have added some new liturgies, updated language in the original liturgies and kept some just the way they were. We realize that modern pastors have unlimited worship resources at the click of a button, on the World Wide Web; however, it is our desire to provide liturgies and rituals that are centered in a biblical foundation and linked to our history and heritage. Our prayer is that this updated volume will be helpful for our pastors and congregations in the worship of our great God and King.

SECTION I SACRAMENTS

SACRAMENT OF INFANT BAPTISM - SERVICE 1

Christian baptism is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ and administered by the church from its beginning. The formal application of water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is a sign and seal to recognize that the person so consecrated stands in a holy covenant relation to God and His people (Article 21, *Articles of Faith*). Recognizing this child/these children as under the atonement of Christ and as part of the spiritual family of God, we consider him/her/them (a) worthy subject(s) for Christian baptism.

Let us give reverent attention to the reading from God's Word, the Gospel of Mark, chapter 10, verses 13 through 16: "People were bringing little children to Jesus to have him touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' And he took the children in his arms, put his hands on them and blessed them."

Address to the Parents/Parent:

As parents/the parent presenting your child for baptism you signify your own personal faith in Jesus Christ; you bear witness to your belief that this/your child stands in holy covenant relation to God and His people through the finished work of Christ, and you publicly affirm the reality of God's grace at work in the life of your child.

Is this your belief and purpose in presenting your child for baptism?

If so, answer: IT IS.

Parental Declaration:

Having affirmed your personal faith in Jesus Christ, it is important that you also recognize the awesome and serious responsibility that is yours as parents/a parent in the raising of the child entrusted to your care.

Will you set before the child the example of a godly life, and will you pray for and with your child, instructing him/her in the elements/beliefs/doctrines of the Christian faith?

If so, answer: WE/I WILL.

Will you seek to lead him/her to acceptance of Jesus Christ as Savior, train him/her in the Christian life, show him/her the way of holiness, and endeavor to bring him/her into the membership of the church?

At the appropriate time, the candidates shall present themselves before the congregation. A hymn fitting the occasion may be sung.

The Minister Shall Address the Congregation:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Let us hear the Word of God as it is recorded in the Acts of the Apostles, the second chapter: "And Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized, everyone of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children and to all that are far off, everyone who the Lord our God calls to Him.' ... So those who received his word were baptized. ... and they devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

Beloved in Christ, forasmuch as our Savior did commission His disciples to go and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we beseech you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of His great mercy, he will grant to this/these person(s) now to be baptized his grace, so that he/she/they may serve him faithfully, be (a) true member(s) of the Church, and (an) heir(s) of eternal life.

A Prayer of Thanksgiving Over the Water May be Offered (Optional):

Then the Minister shall repeat the candidate's name, sprinkle or pour water on his/her forehead OR immerse him/her in water, with the Baptismal Formula:

I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then shall the Minister say to those baptized:

And now dear brother(s)/sister(s), the vows of the Lord are upon you. Of your own free will you have sought this solemn Christian sacrament. You have here pledged allegiance to Jesus Christ, and to Him alone. His appointment is upon you, and you

go forth a confessor of Christ before the world. Be steadfast and true, and let your baptism prove the sacramental seal of a lifelong covenant with God, for our Savior said, "Whosoever shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father in heaven."

Those baptized may here be encouraged to share a brief word of personal testimony before the congregation.

The Minister shall conclude with prayer.

SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE,
WAS CRUCIFIED, DIED, AND WAS BURIED;
HE DESCENDED TO THE DEAD.
ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE AGAIN;
HE ASCENDED INTO HEAVEN,
IS SEATED AT THE RIGHT HAND OF THE FATHER,
AND WILL COME AGAIN TO JUDGE THE LIVING AND THE DEAD.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT,

THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS, THE RESURRECTION OF THE BODY,
AND THE LIFE EVERLASTING.

Then the Minister shall ask each candidate to state his/her full name.

A Prayer of Thanksgiving Over the Water May be Offered (Optional):

Heavenly Father, we ask you now to sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit. Grant that _______(Name(s)) be cleansed from all sin and receive the fullness of your grace, that he/she/they may ever remain faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then the Minister shall repeat the candidate's name, sprinkle or pour water on his/her forehead, OR immerse him/her in water, with the Baptismal Formula:

I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then shall the Minister say to those baptized:

And now dear brother(s)/sister(s), the vows of the Lord are upon you. Of your own free will you have sought this solemn Christian sacrament. You have here pledged allegiance to Jesus Christ, and to Him alone. His appointment is upon you, and you go forth a confessor of Christ before the world. Be steadfast and true, and let your baptism prove the sacramental seal of a lifelong covenant with God, for our Savior said, "Whosoever shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father in heaven."

Those baptized may here be encouraged to share a brief word of personal testimony before the congregation.

The Minister shall conclude with prayer.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION - SERVICE 1

The Lord's Supper should be observed at least four times annually in each congregation. While four times annually is set forth as a minimum, greater frequency is not only permissible but encouraged. Holy Communion may be administered at the altar or in the pews, or for special services on Maundy Thursday or Good Friday, it may be celebrated in a "Last Supper" setting.

As the normal setting for the celebration of the sacrament is the congregation gathered for worship, it is assumed that the sacrament shall be preceded by a sermon based upon an appropriate passage of Scripture.

Collect for Purity (May be prayed by officiant or as a unison prayer of the congregation):

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Invitation to Holy Communion:

You that do truly and earnestly repent of your sins, and are in love and charity with your neighbors, and intend to lead a new life, following the commandments of God, and walking from henceforth in his holy ways: Draw near with faith, and take this Holy Sacrament to your comfort, and make your humble confession to almighty God. (Source: Traditional)

Unison Prayer of Confession followed by Silent Prayer:

Almighty and merciful God, we have erred and strayed from your ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devises and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against your holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; and we have done those things which we ought not

to have done. O Lord, have mercy upon us. Spare those who confess their sins. Restore those who are penitent, according to your promises declared to the world in Christ Jesus, our Lord. And grant, O merciful God, for his sake, that we may live a holy, just, and humble life to the glory of your holy name. Amen. (Source: Traditional)

Or

Merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart and mind and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. In your mercy forgive what we have been, help us amend what we are, and direct what we shall be, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Through Christ, our Lord. Amen. (Source: Traditional)

Words of Assurance of Pardon:

Hear these comforting words recorded in Holy Scripture for all that sincerely turn to the Lord in repentance and faith for forgiveness:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." (John 3:16-17 NIV)

Or

"Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." (1 Timothy 1:15a NIV)

Or

"My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have one who speaks to the Father in our defense - Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world." (1 John 2:1-2 NIV)

Prayer of Consecration / Words of Institution:

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them saying, "Drink this all of you; for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you, and for many for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Send your Holy Spirit now upon these gifts of bread and cup, that we who eat and drink at this holy table might share in the life of Christ, our Lord. Sanctify us also that we might faithfully serve you in unity and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

Gracious Father, we come to this table trusting in your great mercies. May we receive this sacrament with devout, believing, and grateful hearts.

We ask these things through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who taught us to pray. ...

The Lord's Prayer

If the sacrament is to be served at the altar:

The minister shall commune first followed by the congregation.

If the sacrament is being served in the pews:

The minister shall distribute the bread trays to the Communion servants who shall distribute the trays in the pews. After the congregation has been served, the minister shall serve the Communion servants.

Then the minister shall say: "The body of Christ...."

Then the minister and the congregation shall eat of the bread.

Then the minister shall distribute the cup trays to the Communion servants who shall distribute the trays in the pews. After the congregation has been served, the minister shall serve the Communion servants.

Then the minister shall say: "The blood of Christ shed for you...."

Then the minister and the congregation shall drink of the cup.

Distribution of the Bread:

The body of Christ given for you. Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.

Distribution of the Cup:

The blood of Christ shed for you. Drink this in remembrance that Christ's blood was shed for you, and be thankful.

After the Supper is concluded, a Prayer of Thanksgiving may be shared, a hymn sung, and the Benediction offered.

Listen to the words Paul was inspired to write to the church in Ephesus: "But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it. This is why it says: 'When he ascended on high, he led captives in his train and gave gifts to men.' It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." (Ephesians 4:7 & 8, 11-13)

And now the words of our Lord Jesus who said: "I am the true vine and my Father is the gardener ... if a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit: apart from me you can do nothing ... This is to my Father's glory that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples ... You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit - fruit that will last. (John 15:1-17 selected)

Charge to the Elder:

Scriptures you have learned of the dignity and importance of this office to which you are called. In this service of ordination you are charged to remember the dignity and weight of your calling: to be a messenger, watchman and steward of the Lord; to teach and admonish, to feed and provide for the Lord's flock; to gather the outcasts; to seek the lost; and to be ever ready to share the Good News of reconciliation with God, through Jesus Christ our Lord. You are charged to apply yourself without reservation to the ministry to which God has called you, to continually give yourself to the reading and study of God's Word, to prayer for others and for the empowering presence of the Holy Spirit in your life. You are charged to be fully prepared to correctly explain the Word of Truth; and to conduct yourself in such a manner that you may be a godly example for others to follow as you follow Jesus.

Examination of Elder:

And now, that those assembled here today, in the name of Christ, may also understand your mind and will in these things, please answer the following questions before God and His Church.

Do you believe in your heart that you are truly called, according to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, to the office of Elder? If so, answer: I DO BELIEVE.

Are you persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain all doctrine essential to eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ?

If so, answer: I AM SO PERSUADED.

Are you determined to use these Scriptures to instruct the people committed to your care and to teach nothing as essential to eternal salvation but that which is contained in and proved by the Scriptures?

If so, answer: I HAVE SO DETERMINED.

Will you then give faithful diligence to administer the sacraments, preach the doctrines of Christ, and observe and execute the <u>Discipline</u> of the Church as the Lord has commanded you?

If so, answer: I WILL, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

Will you be ready by all faithful diligence to disprove and banish all erroneous and strange doctrines contrary to God's Word and to use both public and private admonitions as the need shall require and occasion shall be given?

If so, answer: I WILL, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

Will you be diligent in prayer and in reading the Holy Scriptures, and in such studies as are helpful to the knowledge of the same?

If so, answer: I WILL.

Will you be diligent to fashion yourself and your familiy according to the doctrine of Christ; and to make both yourself and them, as much as you are able, wholesome examples and patterns to the people of Christ?

If so, answer: I WILL, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

Will you, to the extent of your ability, cultivate and maintain harmony, peace, and love among all people, especially among those who are committed to your care?

If so, answer: I WILL, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

Will you reverently submit to your superiors in office, to whom is committed the charge over you, following with a ready heart and willing mind their godly counsels and admonitions?

If so, answer: I WILL, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

May God Almighty, who has given you the desire to do all these things, grant to you ability to do them, that He may accomplish His work begun in you, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Confessions of Faith:

And now let us, the gathered congregation of God's people, all confess our faith as we join together in reciting in unison the Apostles' Creed.

Receive this license, granted by the National Conference of the Evangelical Congregational Church, as a further testimony of the authority of the holy office of Elder.

Then the Bishop, or Presiding Officer, with assisting Elder, laying their hands upon the head of the candidate, the Bishop shall say:

The Lord pour upon you the Holy Spirit for the office and work of an Elder in the Church of God, now committed to you by authority of the Church, through the imposition of our hands. Be a faithful dispenser of the Word of God, and of the Holy Sacraments; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The gospel according to Matthew tells us, "Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)

(The Elder and his wife rise and face the congregation for the closing prayer.)

Let us pray.

(An extemporaneous prayer may be offered for the pastor, wife, and family or the prayer below may be used.)

Heavenly Father, we ask You to give Your servant the riches of Your grace and the guidance and power of the Holy Spirit, so that, with clearness of discernment and readiness of word, he may declare the whole counsel of God and that, the church may be encouraged and moved to maturity in godliness and that the lost be converted and gathered in the fold of Christ. Grant that in all things ______ may seek Your glory alone and the increase of Your kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Father, we ask that you bless ______ (Candidate) and _____ (Candidate's wife) today and in the days to come.

We know that in ministry there are challenging times as well as seasons of great joy. Strengthen their love for each other and for you as they minister together. Fill them and us with your gracious presence and favor throughout our lives that we may glorify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Benediction to the Church Gathered:

May the peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep our hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God and of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among us and remain with us always. Amen.

(The Elder may choose to address the congregation.)

CONSECRATION OF A BISHOP

(At the time and place appointed a Service of Worship, prior to the sermon, a hymn shall be sung, the service shall proceed as follows.)

The Invocation:

Almighty God, through your Son, Jesus Christ, you established and gifted, apostles, elders and evangelists, charging them to feed your flock. We pray your grace upon all the ministers of your Church that they may diligently preach and teach your Word, equipping and discipling those in their care to faithfully follow Jesus in obedience, joy and strength, sharing the Good News that has been planted in their hearts. Amen.

The Scripture Lessons:

(Read by a former Bishop or other designated denominational official.)

1 Timothy 3:1-7 St. John 15:15-19

(Then shall the Presiding Bishop address the congregation.)

Dear friends, before you stands our brother ______, who we believe has been called by God and has been duly elected by the delegates of the Evangelical Congregational Church to serve as our Bishop. In order that you may know and hear his heart, and that he is committed to this office, we will question him as to his faith and purpose. Please pray with me.

Almighty God, giver of all good things, who by your Holy Spirit has appointed various offices in your Church; graciously behold your servant ______, now called to the Office and ministry of a Bishop. We ask that you replenish him with truth of your

doctrine, and empower him with the strength of your Holy Spirit, that both by word and deed he may faithfully serve you in this Office, to the glory of your Name and the building up and governing of your Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The questions (proposed by the Presiding Bishop):

Brother ______, are you willing the Lord being your helper, to accept the Office of Bishop in the Evangelical Congregational Church?

Answer: I AM WILLING, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

Are you persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain all doctrine which is necessary for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ? And are you determined out of the same Scriptures to instruct the people committed to your charge; and to teach or maintain nothing, as necessary to eternal salvation, but that which you shall be persuaded may be concluded and proved by the same?

Answer: I AM SO PERSUADED AND DETERMINED, BY GOD'S GRACF.

Will you then, faithfully exercise yourself in the Holy Scriptures, and call upon God by prayer for a true understanding of the same; so that you may be able to use the Scriptures to teach and exhort with wholesome doctrine, and to withstand the opposers of the same?

Answer: I WILL ENDEAVOR TO DO SO, BY THE HELP OF GOD.

Are you ready, with all faithful diligence, to oppose and defend the church against all erroneous and strange doctrine contrary to God's Word; and both privately and openly to call upon and encourage others to do the same?

Answer: I AM READY, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

Will you deny all ungodliness and worldly lusts, and live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world; that you may show yourself in all things an example of good works unto others?

Answer: I WILL ENDEAVOR TO DO SO, THE LORD BEING MY HELPER.

Will you maintain and set forward, quietness, love, and peace among all people? And will you diligently live out a disciplined life as commanded in God's Word and by the principles of this denomination?

Answer: I WILL ENDEAVOR TO DO SO, BY THE HELP OF GOD.

Will you be faithful in the responsibility of administering Ordination?

Answer: I WILL SO BE, BY THE HELP OF GOD

The Prayer for Performance:

May Almighty God who has called you to this office of Bishop, give you the wisdom and power to keep these vows so that he may accomplish the good work he has begun in you, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

(The candidate kneels.)

The Consecration:

The Bishops shall gather around the candidate, and if there be present any Bishops of like-minded denominations, they shall be invited to join the gathering. They shall lay their hands on the head of the candidate, and the Presiding Bishop shall say:

The Lord pour upon you the Holy Spirit for the Office and work of a Bishop in the Evangelical Congregational Church, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

(While the candidate remains kneeling, the Senior Bishop shall offer the Prayer of Consecration.)

Almighty God and most merciful Father. We thank you for giving to us your only Son, Jesus Christ to be our redeemer and the Author of eternal life. We thank you that after he accomplished your will through the crucifixion and resurrection, he ascended into Heaven and gave gifts to his Church, making some Apostles, some Prophets, some Evangelists, some Pastors and Teachers, for the building up and perfecting of his Church.

We now pray for your servant, our brother who has been called and is accepting the solemn responsibility of the office of Bishop of the Evangelical Congregational Church. As he discharges his duties as overseer, may you grant him grace to use the authority granted to him for good and not evil, for building up and not tearing down. Empower him to be a wise and faithful servant of Jesus Christ and his Church and give him joy in this labor. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

(Then shall a Bishop Emeritus give the Charge.)

Charge:

Give priority to reading and studying the Scriptures to understand the will of God and to lead us in the same. Do the work of an evangelist, always proclaiming in word and deed the Good News of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ alone. Shepherd the flock under your care, hold up the weak, heal the sick, bind up the broken-hearted, bring in the outcasts and seek the lost. Exercise discipline with intentionality and grace so that when the Chief Shepherd returns you may receive the never-fading crown of glory, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

The Presiding Bishop shall pronounce the grace:

The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all evermore. Amen.

A hymn shall be sung, chosen by the new Bishop, after which the service shall continue and may consist of the new Bishop's testimony, his charge to the people, etc.

At the conclusion of the entire service, the new Bishop shall pronounce the benediction.

COMMISSIONING OF MISSIONARIES

Bishop or Global Ministries Associate:

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus: We greet you in the name of our God who purposed for the whole world to know His saving grace. In obedience to His command we meet here for this commissioning service.

As an evangelical denomination we are persuaded that God would have all people to be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth. We further hold that Christ's death provides atonement for the sins of the whole world. We believe that this gospel should be proclaimed to every tribe and people. You have responded to God's call upon your life to make this truth known in obedience to the Great Commission. "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation …" (Mark 16:15)

We are grateful that your church has a share in this commissioning service with us today. This body of believers will be a means of strengthening you and a source of great inspiration.

Global Ministries Associate:

Yours is a high calling for it is a solemn responsibility to share the living Christ. The Bible tells us God appointed apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up. Our exhortation to you is in the words of scripture where Paul writes, "As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Now you are presenting yourself/yourselves before the Lord of the Church, and us as members of this congregation, in order to take your vows as (a) fellow-member(s) of this body of believers.

We are strengthened by hearing your public declaration of this purpose. We believe you also will be strengthened as you affirmatively answer the questions that follow:

We are a congregation affiliated with the Evangelical Congregational Church. We believe that the Bible is the inspired Word of God. Do you believe this and that only in these Divine writings do we find the Christian message of salvation?

At the day and time appointed, the persons to be married shall stand together, the man on the right hand and the woman on the left, as they face the pastor.

In the Word of God we read: "A wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding" (John 2:1-2).

Dear Friends, we have come together in the sight of God, and in the presence of these witnesses, to attend the uniting of this man and this woman in holy matrimony. This state is not to be entered unadvisedly or lightly, but discreetly, reverently, and in the fear of God. Forasmuch as marriage is ordained of God, it is necessary for those who enter the marriage covenant to consider with reverent mind and heart what the Word of God teaches about it.

The Lord God said: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him" (Genesis 2:18).

Our Lord Jesus Christ said: "Haven't you read, that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female' and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'?" (Matthew 19:4-5).

The highest goal you can have before you is spoken through the Apostle Paul: "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her," and "the wife must respect her husband" (*Ephesians 5:25, 33b*).

Presentation:

If the woman is presented in marriage, the pastor asks the presenter(s):

Who gives this woman in marriage?

Father, or other appointed person, Answer: I DO / HER MOTHER AND I DO.

Address to the Couple and Prayer:

The pastor shall address the couple and offer prayer:

and ______ you are about to assume mutual relationships and responsibilities, and to pledge to each other your undying devotion and fidelity. The union into which you are now to enter is the closest and tenderest into which human beings can come. It is a union founded upon mutual understanding and love, and to Christian people it is a union in the Lord. Since marriage is God's institution, and is intended for the happiness and welfare of mankind, it is fitting that we seek His blessing upon your marriage.

Let us pray.

Our gracious and loving Heavenly Father, You have taught us that if in all our ways we acknowledge you, you will direct our paths. We come therefore to seek your guidance and blessing upon these your servants, now to be joined in the bonds of matrimony. Help each to live for the other, O God, and grant that each may enrich the other's life. Unite their hearts, we pray so that no storm of life will be able to shake their faith in each other, or in you. Be with them in sunshine or shadow, in joy or sorrow, and may their home be your abiding place, and you their constant guest, we pray in Jesus' name. Amen.

Declaration of Intention by the Man and the Woman:

The pastor gives the following charges to the persons who are to marry:

Blessing and Exchange of Rings:

The pastor shall say to the man: What do you give as a sign of your love and sincerity?

The man: A RING.

Attendant places the ring in the groom's right hand, who in turn passes it in the minister's right hand.

The pastor shall say to the woman:

What do you give as a sign of your love and sincerity?

The woman: A RING.

Attendant places the ring in the bride's right hand, who in turn places it in the minister's right hand.

Then the minister shall say:

Let these rings be to you both a symbol of the purity and permanence of true wedded love, and a seal of the sacred vows you have taken this day, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

To the man:
You will place the ring on the third finger of the left hand, and
repeat the following vow:

Declaration of Marriage:
Then the minister shall say:

commonwealth/state*, pronounce you husband and wife
together, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy $$
Spirit. "What God has joined together, let man not separate"

(Matthew 19:6).

Blessing of the Marriage:

Let us pray: (The couple may kneel.)

Eternal God, send your blessing upon these your servants, this man and this woman, whom we bless in your name. May they live faithfully together, sincerely perform and keep the vows and covenant between them made. Grant them grace to live according to your Word; strengthen them in constant fidelity and true affection toward each other; sustain and defend them in all trials and temptations, and help them so to pass through this world in faith toward you, in communion with your Holy Church, and in loving service one to the other, that they may forever enjoy your heavenly benediction, through Jesus Christ, your Son, Our Lord, we pray. Amen.

The husband and wife may continue to kneel, as all pray the Lord's Prayer.

Benediction:

Then shall the pastor give the Benediction:

The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious unto you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace (*Numbers* 6:24-26).

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all (2 Corinthians 13:14).

Going Forth:

A hymn may be sung or instrumental music played as the couple, the wedding party, and the people leave.

• The Lord's Supper may be inserted following line 11 as desired. This would include the invitation, a prayer of consecration and the distribution of the elements.

The Service of Committal:

The service of committal is not meant to be an extension, let alone a recapitulation of the funeral or memorial. Rather, it is a reminder of what has been already affirmed; hope, for the Christian, is hope grounded in Jesus' victory over death.

It is important to leave the sorrowing family and friends with a firm sense of closure while reassuring them once again that, for those who are in Jesus Christ, there is no final goodbye.

The service proposed here is in four parts:

- 1. One or two scripture sentences
- 2. The words of committal (which will vary according to the disposition of the body)
- 3. A brief prayer of committal
- 4. A benediction

Suggested Scripture Sentences:

"Blessed be the LORD, who has given rest to His people." 1 Kings 8:56a

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." John 14:27

"If the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through His Spirit that dwells in you." Romans 8:11

"God gives us eternal life, and this life is in His Son." 1 John 5:11

"Let your steadfast love, O LORD, be upon us, even as we hope in You." *Psalm 32:22*

Words of Committal:

For earth burial:

In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen,

Or

Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, in sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ,

we commend to God's merciful care our brother/sister ______; and we commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

"Blessed are the dead who ... die in the Lord. ... they will rest from their labors, for their deeds will follow them" (Revelation 14:13).

For burial at sea: In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen,
Or
Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, in sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ,
we commend to God's merciful care our brother/sister; and we commit his/her body to the dead.
"Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord they will res from their labors, for their deeds will follow them" (Revelation 14:13).
For cremation: In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen,
Or
Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, in sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ,
we commend to God's merciful care our brother/sister; and we commit his/her body to be returned to the elements, ashes to ashes. (If committal takes place in a columbarium substitute: "We commit his/her ashes to their final resting place.")
"Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord they will res from their labors, for their deeds will follow them" (Revelation 14:13).
Suggested Prayers: You sent your Son, Jesus Christ, to bring life and immortality to light. We entrust to your everlasting care

Grant us the awareness that each of our days is a true gift from you, to be lived preciously and joyously in hopeful expectation of eternal life in divine presence with those whom we love. In the name of Jesus, the Lord of life, we pray. Amen.

O LORD, support us all the day long, until the shadows lengthen, and the evening comes, and the busy world is hushed, and the fever of life is over, and our work is done. Then, in your mercy, grant us a safe lodging, and a holy rest, and peace at the last; through Jesus Christ, our LORD. Amen.

EXAMPLE OF A FUNERAL AND COMMITTAL SERVICE

The following is an example of a Funeral Liturgy created by one pastor. The service is suitable for a service within the church, especially with the inclusion of hymns, as well as the funeral home. While references to the deceased is both expected and appropriate, it needs to be emphasized that the primary purpose of the service is to focus on the promises of the Gospel which offer true hope, and comfort, and through which God imparts, through the hearing of the Gospel, the gift of faith. This is only one suggested model and it is expected that it may be adapted as each pastor feels appropriate. Interspersed through the service are brief notes of explanation.

A Service of Death and Resurrection:

Greeting:

We have come together this morning for a service of worship, remembrance, and thanksgiving.

Note: For pastoral reasons it may be meaningful to make special reference to the significant relationships of the deceased. Mentioning persons by name is an opportunity to communicate pastoral concern for family members and to emphasize, "This service is for you."

We also come together to affirm our faith and to give thanks to God for the Gospel of Jesus Christ which promises the forgiveness of sins and eternal life to all who come to Christ in faith.

And we come together in Christian love to comfort one another with the comfort that we ourselves have received from God.

May God grant us grace, that in pain we may find comfort; in sorrow, hope; and in death, resurrection.

May You Hear Through These Verses of Scripture the Comfort and Hope of the Gospel:

John 11:25-26

25 Jesus said... "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, 26 and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die."

John 3:16-17

16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. 17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

Matthew 11:28-30

28 "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Prayer:

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who loves us with an everlasting love, and can turn the darkness of sorrow into the morning, help us to be open to your presence, grace, and love in this hour. Give us trusting and believing hearts. Speak to us of eternal things by your Spirit through Scripture and the experience of worship. Give us hope, O Lord, that we may be able to pass

safely through the valley of the shadow of death into the light of your presence. Grant us peace, through Christ, we pray. Amen.

Optional Element: Hymn

Note: In meeting with the family to plan the service it is helpful to ask if their loved one had a favorite hymn. You may consider incorporating a favorite hymn or hymns in the service either for congregational singing or included as a quotation in the sermon.

Note: In selecting passages of Scripture for the lessons try to include any of the favorite passages of the deceased. When reference is made to a favorite hymn or passage of Scripture it serves as a word of personal testimony of the one whose life we have gathered to remember.

Note: The lessons below are only examples. There are many other passages that could be selected. You will note that before each reading there is a brief introduction to the passage's main theme to help listeners grasp the Gospel expressed through the text.

Old Testament Lesson Psalm 23

(Testifying to and inviting our confidence in God's Shepherd-like care, faithful presence, and promise of eternal life.)

Epistle Lesson

1 Peter 1:3-9

(Testifying to the Christian hope of resurrection.)

Gospel Lesson

John 14:1-7, 15-20, 25-27

(The truth of heaven, Gospel teaching on the way of salvation through faith in Christ, the peace that Christ promises to all who are his disciples.)

Optional Element: An Invitation for Others to Share

Note: I was always open to having family members share personal remarks. I cautioned against opening a sharing time to everyone because comments shared were not always appropriate and in fact could add unnecessary length to the service as well as distract from the primary focus of proclaiming the comfort and hope of the Gospel.

Optional Element: Hymn

Sermon:

Note: As I prepared my sermon for the service I began with what was expected, words about the deceased, but then moved to the primary focus of proclaiming Christ and the Gospel. When planning the service, I would not only inquire as to any favorite passages of Scripture or hymns but also ask for words descriptive of the deceased. I would often hear words such as loving, faithful, kind, generous, etc. I appreciated the counsel suggesting that you use one of these words to build a bridge in the message from words about the deceased to the Gospel. For example: loving -God's love; faithful - God's faithfulness; kind - God's kindness; generous - God's generosity.

Closing Invitation to Faith in Christ:

Pastoral Prayer: Lord, we thank you for the life of ______

We praise and thank you for the Gospel message of forgiveness, new life, and life eternal - all the gifts of your grace to be received through faith.

We pray asking for your comfort - for one another and for ourselves. Especially we pray for _____

We pray asking for ourselves and one another the gift of faith and ask that you would receive in your grace all that trust you today for forgiveness and new life through repentance and faith. In Christ's name we pray. Amen.

Optional Element: Hymn

Benediction:

The peace of God which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and the love of God, and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you, and remain with you always.

Committal Service:

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

13 "But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. 14 For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. 15 For this we declare to you by a word from the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. 16 For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. 18 Therefore encourage one another with these words."

Words of Committal:

In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, we commend to God's merciful care our brother/sister, _____, and we commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

Revelation 14:13

"And I heard a voice from heaven saying, 'Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on.' 'Blessed indeed,' says the Spirit, 'that they may rest from their labors, for their deeds follow them!'"

Committal Prayer:

Heavenly Father, you sent your Son Jesus Christ to bring life and immortality to light. We entrust ______ to your everlasting care. Grant us the awareness that each of our days is a true gift from you, to be lived preciously and joyously in hopeful expectation of eternal life in divine presence with those whom we love. In the name of Jesus Christ, the Lord of life we pray. Amen.

Optional Element: The Lord's Prayer (Prayed in unison)

Note: When inviting a unison praying of the Lord's Prayer, it is advisable to state whether you will use trespasses, debts, sins, etc. Example: "Please join with me in praying together the Lord's Prayer, using debts and debtors."

Benediction:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.

THE FUNERAL OF A CHILD

In the following guidelines for the funeral service for a child, it is important to reassure the grieving parents, family and friends that the child has passed into the presence and care of the Gentle Shepherd whose loving arms were waiting to embrace His child and give everlasting peace. It is intended at the same time to assure the survivors of the tender mercies of God as He sustains the family through their loss and brings them to renewed joy while at the same time exhorting them to trust in the promise of eternal life through Jesus Christ and the glorious reunion that awaits them in His Heavenly Kingdom.

The proposed guidelines consist of elements that may be used in a more formal church service, or at a funeral home when music accompaniment is not utilized.

*Prelude:

Opening or Greeting:

"He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart...." Isaiah 40:11

"Jesus said to his disciples, 'Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy." John 16:22

"The Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." Revelation 7:17

*Hymn:

Dear friends, we have gathered here in our grief to praise God and witness to our faith. We come together in grief, acknowledging our human loss of one so young. O God, whose dear Son took little children into his arms and blessed them; give us grace, we pray, to entrust this child to your never-failing love and care; and bring us all to your eternal life; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O God, we pray that you will keep in your tender love the life of this child whom we hold in blessed memory. Help us who continue here to serve you with constancy, trusting in your promise of eternal life, that hereafter we may be united with your blessed children in glory everlasting; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

God of all mercies, whose heart aches with our human hurting, we commend to your love the parent(s) of this child, _____ and all his/her/their children who mourn. Sustain the family in this loss and in their loneliness. Kindle anew the ashes of joy. Grant the peace of knowing that this child is with you both in this life and in the life that is to come; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

Benediction:

Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do God's will, working in you that which is pleasing in God's sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever.

The God of all grace who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will Himself restore, support, strengthen, and establish you. To Him be the power forever and ever. Amen.

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ lesus our Lord.

Go in peace, remembering Jesus' words to his beloved disciples: "I will not leave you comfortless; I will come to you. And I will pray (to) the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever."

Meditation:

Funerals are for the living rather than for the dead. In the case of one who does not profess to be a Christian the minister should avoid the extreme of condemning the deceased to eternal punishment or preaching the deceased into heaven. He must avoid judging the heart as well as giving false hope. The Good News of the Gospel can be faithfully presented without saying that the promised blessings necessarily apply to the deceased.

The meditation could be as simple and powerful as sharing the Christian hope as outlined in <u>Steps to Peace with God</u> by Billy Graham. A simple presentation of the basics of the Christian hope: (1) God's Idea: Peace and Life Forever; (2) Our Problem: Sin gets in the way; (3) God's Answer: The Cross; and (4) Our Part: Accept Christ.

The funeral service is a unique opportunity to speak to the living about their imminent death. It is not a question of will they

die – it is only a question of when they will die. While we can't do anything for the dead, we can minister to the living by sharing with them a positive message of the Christian hope which depends upon a personal relationship to the Lord Jesus Christ.

A SERVICE OF HEALING

The service of healing may become a corporate worship experience in which those who are ministering become conduits of God's love and grace. Healing precedes from the presence of God among us. The service of healing is not intended to replace medical care, surgery, mental health treatment, or any other accepted forms of healthcare; but recognizing that God works through many of these channels, the service is intended to be part of a total health care regime. It should be noted that the service of healing is not intended to be a guarantee of complete physical restoration, although that may happen; the purpose is to acknowledge God's presence with us in our suffering and His ability to heal if it is His will. Since it is hoped that all who feel their need of the Lord's healing mercy will participate, it is suggested that church leaders/elders participate in accordance with James 5:14, "Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord." It is also appropriate to include the Lord's Supper in a healing service. This particular service is designed so it may include either anointing with oil or the laying on of hands.

Opening Prayer:

Eternal and everlasting heavenly Father, we recognize you as the One who forgives all of our sins and heals all of our diseases. You are the One who knit us together in our mother's womb and you can cure our soul and body of every affliction. We pray that you would show forth Your grace and power upon those in need today of your healing mercy. For we believe the healing touch of Jesus is just as real today as when He walked upon the earth. May Your compassion and mercy show forth in what transpires here today. Be glorified in Jesus, in whose name we pray. Amen.

Pastor:

Throughout the pages of Scripture we witness the mystery of spiritual healing. The root of the Greek word interpreted "healing" in the New Testament, *sozo*, is the same root as the words for salvation and wholeness. God offers wholeness of body, mind, and spirit through His healing touch. Through our praise, confession, and worship, we acknowledge God's willingness to provide salvation and wholeness for the people He loves.

Affirmation of Faith (To be led by a church leader/elder):

"Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise" (James 5:13). "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name" (Psalm 103:1)! May we unite our hearts and voices in praise as together we affirm our faith using the words of the Apostles' Creed.

Prayer of Confession (To be led by a church leader/elder):

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock and it will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). Friends, God knows our needs before we ask, but the act of asking prepares us to receive His gift of grace. We read in Holy Scripture, the book of James, that confession is an integral part of healing. We read in James 5:16: "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed." As we come to this time

of confession, let us remove every barrier that stands between God and ourselves. Take to heart God's promise recorded in 1 John 1:9: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

The following Prayer of Confession may be Prayed in Unison:

Heavenly Father, you are our rock and hiding place. You have provided your work of redemption, while we were still lost in rebellion against you. We thank You for your compassion and the unconditional love you provide for your children. Cleanse our lives now from all unrighteousness and grant us your gift of healing for our body, mind, and soul. Amen.

At this point the service could continue with either the Laying on of Hands or Anointing. Olive oil is the oil traditionally used in anointing.

Pastor:

Will those who desire to receive the laying on of hands and/or anointing please come forward at this time? Please be united in prayer for those seeking God's touch.

Laying on of Hands:

The Laying on of Hands illustrates the power of touch which accompanied many of the healings depicted for us in the New Testament. In the case of lepers or other outcasts, the touch of Jesus was probably almost as welcome as the healing the touch provided. The touch in the Laying on of Hands is a tangible expression of the presence of the healing Christ, working in and through those who minister in His name.

(Pronounce the individual name of each candidate upon which hands are to be laid.)

We lay our hands upon you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. May God grant you forgiveness for your sins; may He release you from the pain of suffering; may He restore you to wholeness in mind, body and soul; and may His Holy Spirit abide and comfort you through all adversity. (The individual's personal need may also be addressed at this time if they wish to state it.) We humbly request this in the name of our Lord who healed all the afflicted. Amen.

Anointing:

Pastor:

Anointing with oil is a sign invoking the power of God for the purpose of healing. Throughout scripture, oil is representative of the presence of the Holy Spirit. The oil points beyond itself and those ministering through the anointing to the action of the Holy Spirit and the presence of God's anointed One, Jesus Christ.

(Pronounce the individual name of each candidate as the oil is applied. The oil may be dabbed on the forehead or it may be applied in the sign of the cross.)

We anoint you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. May God grant you forgiveness for your sins; may He release you from the pain of suffering; may He restore you to wholeness in mind, body and soul; and may His Holy Spirit abide and comfort you through all adversity. (The individual's personal need may also be addressed at this time if they wish to state it.) We humbly request this in the name of our Lord who healed all the afflicted. Amen.

Prayer of Thanksgiving:

Our compassionate and merciful Heavenly Father, we recognize you as the source from whom all healing flows. We thank you for the gift of your Son, without whom salvation and complete healing would be impossible. We also thank you for the privilege of being used, as your disciples, to continue the healing

ministry you instituted on earth. Thank you for your gift of precious life on this earth and eternal life when we leave this world. Amen.

This service was developed for use at St. Paul's Evangelical Congregational Church, Rothsville, PA, as a Service of Prayer for Healing in the setting of a Service of Holy Communion. In "A Service of Healing," which begins on page 90 of the <u>Pastor's Book of Services</u>, you will find listings of suggested Scripture, hymns, and worship songs appropriate for services of healing.

Greeting:

May grace and peace be yours in abundance in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord. (2 Peter 1:2)

We have come to lift up our brothers and sisters before the Lord that they might receive healing. Let those who seek God's healing open their hearts to the Spirit of the Lord.

Let us Bless the Lord through Psalm:

Leader: Bless the Lord, O my soul!

Congregation: AND ALL THAT IS WITHIN ME, BLESS HIS HOLY

NAME!

Leader: Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits. Congregation: THE LORD FORGIVES ALL OUR INIQUITY, AND HEALS ALL OUR DISEASES.

Leader: The Lord redeems our lives from the pit, and crowns us

with steadfast love and mercy.

Congregation: GOD SATISFIES US WITH GOOD AS LONG AS WE LIVE SO THAT OUR YOUTH IS RENEWED LIKE THE EAGLE'S.

*Hymn of Praise: "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing"

*Prayer:

Almighty and everlasting God, who can banish all affliction both of soul and of body, show forth your power upon those in need, that by your mercy they may be restored to serve you afresh in holiness of living, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

MEDITATION on Scripture

Confession and Pardon:

Call to Confession (James 5:14-16)

Silent Prayer

Pastor: Hear the good news: Christ died for us while we were yet sinners; that proves God's love toward us. In the name of Jesus

Christ, you are forgiven!

Congregation: IN THE NAME OF JESUS CHRIST, WE ARE

FORGIVEN. GLORY TO GOD. AMEN.

Holy Communion:

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

Congregation: AND ALSO WITH YOU.

Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

Congregation: WE LIFT THEM UP TO THE LORD. Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Congregation: IT IS RIGHT TO GIVE OUR THANKS AND PRAISE.

Pastor: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth. In the beginning, when darkness covered the face of the earth and nothing existed but chaos, your Spirit swept across the waters. You spoke but a word, and light was separated from darkness. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Congregation: HOLY, HOLY, HOLY LORD, GOD OF POWER AND MIGHT, HEAVEN AND EARTH ARE FULL OF YOUR GLORY. HOSANNA IN THE HIGHEST. BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD. HOSANNA IN THE HIGHEST.

Pastor: Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ: who lived among us and knew human pain and suffering; who called all who were burdened and heavy laden and gave them rest; who healed the sick, fed the hungry, and ate with sinners; who cast out demons and showed us the way to you through faith; who took our suffering upon himself, that we might be cleansed of our sins and receive eternal life. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection, you gave birth to your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:

"Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Congregation: CHRIST HAS DIED; CHRIST IS RISEN; CHRIST WILL COME AGAIN.

Pastor: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. By the same Spirit heal us in body, mind, and spirit, cleansing away all that would separate us from you. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in victory, and we

feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

Congregation: AMEN.

Pastor: The body of Christ, given for you.

Congregation: AMEN.

Pastor: The blood of Christ, given for you.

Congregation: AMEN.

The Bread and Cup received.

Prayers for Healing:

Pastor: Almighty God, your Son, Jesus Christ healed many as a sign that your reign has come near. As his disciples we are called to continue his ministry of healing and reconciliation with prayer, the laying on of hands and anointing. Now in prayer we entrust to you, in the name of Christ, all those who are in need of healing and reconciliation. God of the Nations, we ask for the healing of all strife in the world between nations, communities and individuals that all peoples may walk in your ways of righteousness and live in your peace. In your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: Strong and abiding God, give comfort to those who suffer,

grant relief, grant refreshment; in your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: Heavenly Father, have mercy on all your children who live in mental distress. Restore them to strength of mind and cheerfulness of spirit; in your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: Merciful God, you do not willingly afflict or grieve your children, Look with pity on the sorrows of your children. Remember your children with mercy, strengthen them with patience and comfort them with memories of your goodness; in

your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: God of Power, grant that all those who suffer illness feel the help of your power that sickness may turn to health and sorrow into joy; in your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: Patient God, look with compassion upon all who through addiction have lost their health and freedom. Remove their fears and strengthen their recovery. For those who care for them grant understanding and persevering love; in your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: Ageless God, for those increasing in years and infirmities we ask for homes of dignity and peace, helpers and a willingness to accept help. Increase their faith and assurance of your love; in your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, Father of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, we pray for families. Grant that all in families will come to truly be brothers and sisters with Jesus Christ, following his example of truth and love. May our families become safe harbors. May the love of God and love for one another guide their lives; in your great mercy.

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: Eternal God, as we have gathered in this time and place, we remember all those who are in need of your healing touch. We offer those names and petitions both with our lips and with the sighs of hearts that are too deep for words. We remember especially...; in your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: God of Heaven and Earth, we remember before you all our dearly departed. Keep us in union with them through faith and love toward you, that in the fullness of your time we may enter into your kingdom where all tears will be wiped away and all sorrow will turn to interest the result.

to joy; in your great mercy,

Congregation: HEAR US, O GOD.

Pastor: Generous God, we offer our thanks and praise to the God who listens when we call out. Grant us grace to trust your mercy for all for whom we pray.

Congregation: AMEN.

Hymn of Praise: "Spirit of the Living God"

Consecration of Oil:

Pastor: O God, the giver of health and salvation, we give thanks to you for the gift of oil. As your holy apostles anointed many who were sick and healed them, so pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on this gift, that those who in faith and repentance receive this anointing may be made whole; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Congregation: AMEN.

Prayers for Healing and Wholeness with Anointing and/or Laying on of Hands:

Everyone is invited to come forward individually or as a group to the communion rail and express any specific concerns they may have. As anyone comes, he or she will be invited to express the concerns of the heart or body to the pastor or designated person. In response, the following will occur:

______, these hands are laid upon you in the name of Jesus, the Christ, your Savior and Healer.

May the power of God's indwelling presence heal you of all illnesses - of body, mind, spirit, and relationships - that you may serve God with a loving heart. AMEN.

Prayer:

Almighty God, we pray that our brothers and sisters may be comforted in their suffering and made whole.

When they are afraid, give them courage;

when they feel weak, grant them your strength;

when they are afflicted, afford them patience;

when they are lost, offer them hope;

when they are alone, move us to their side; when death comes, open your arms to receive Your servant. In the name of Jesus Christ we pray. AMEN.

Sharing of Thanksgivings:

Persons who feel so led may give thanks for healing or other blessings.

*Dismissal with Blessing:

Pastor: The Lord who heals all your iniquity bless and keep you; the face of the Lord who heals all your afflictions shine upon you and be gracious to you; the light of the countenance of the Lord who redeems your life be lifted upon you and give you peace. AMEN.
