The Gift of Peace

What is your definition of peace? Tranquility? Harmony? The absence of conflict? No matter how it is defined, most people would like to see it under the tree or overflowing the stockings hung by the fireplace this Christmas! According to the 2025 Global Peace Index (Yes, there is such a thing. You can check it out at www.economicsandpeace.org.), the world has become less peaceful over the last seventeen years. No surprise here. Survey any demographic of people, and you will find very few have an expectation of experiencing global peace. However, in the midst of our turbulent world, one of the most recognizable Advent passages of Scripture, Isaiah 9:1-7, promises a time of peace where there will be no more gloom, distress or darkness. No more oppressors, warriors, blood or battles. A time where there will be justice, righteousness and peace! I will admit that global peace, national peace, even local peace, seems too much to ask for, too much to comprehend, so the good news of the Gospel translates this global peace down to a very personal level of peace for any and every person who wants it through the advent of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace.

Isaiah begins chapter nine in verses 1-2 with a dark picture of gloom and distress and then declares that people walking in darkness, living in darkness, navigating the valley of the shadow of death as it were, will have a great Light! His name is Jesus, and he himself declares to be the Light of the world (John 8:12). Peace as light? Absolutely! To speak of Jesus in terms of light is to speak in a universal language. For most of our world's population, light is something to love and embrace while darkness is something to fear.

Not only peace as light, but Isaiah also continues in verses 3-5 to describe peace as joy for those in sorrow. The angels who announced the birth of Jesus proclaimed, "good tidings of great joy." Why? "For unto you a savior is born" (Luke 2:10-11). In other words, you now have someone in your corner, someone who gets you, someone who loves you, someone who will fight to the death for you and then come back from the grave for you to live with you and give you an abundant, secure life! That my friends is cause for pure joy!

Finally, in verse 6-7, Isaiah prescribes peace for those who are oppressed. The English word, "oppression," comes from the Latin word which means, "a pressing down." The greatest oppressor in history is not government, economics or even harmful human treatment. The greatest oppressor is the opposition of the Prince of Peace. His name is Satan, and for now he is "the prince of the power of the air" (Ephesians 2:2-4). However, our Prince of Peace, Jesus, rules and reigns supreme. The government is on his shoulders, and his Kingdom will be everlasting!

Jesus came that first Advent season to be peace and to make peace for any who place their lives in his hands. Brothers and sisters, enjoy this Good News and shout it from the roof tops this Advent season. Remind all who will listen, "For God in all his fullness was pleased to live in Christ, and through him God reconciled everything to himself. He made peace with everything in heaven and on earth by means of Christ's blood on the cross" (Colossians 1:19-20). May the peace of Christ rule in your hearts this Advent and Christmas season!

The annual Treasurer's Guide and the 2026 Ministry Fund forms are now available within the Members' Section of the EC website. Additionally, the updated Pastoral Compensation forms may be accessed online. All forms are located in the designated Members' Section for your convenience.

A couple of end of the year reminders:

- Pastoral Compensation Forms should be returned to the EC Church Center by **December 31, 2025**.
- The Annual Statistical Report is due to the EC Church Center, 100 W Park Ave, Myerstown, PA 17067, by **January 25, 2026**. An Electronic Reporting option is available.
- W-2 forms for employees, including pastors, and 1099-NEC forms for independent contractors are due by January 31, 2026, to the recipient and to the respective government agency. The 1099-NEC is a newer form which replaces the 1099-MISC in most instances for churches; payments made during 2025 are to be filed by February 2, 2026. Pastors are employees of the local church and should receive a W-2 with federal, state and local taxes withheld from every paycheck.


